#### INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

#### I. SECURING DOCUMENTS:

Copies of the Contract Documents are on file at the offices of the Camden Parking Authority, 10 Delaware Avenue, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor Administration Office, Camden Waterfront Garage, Camden, New Jersey 08102. Copies of the document may be obtained from the Owner under the conditions set forth in the Invitation to Bid.

#### II. BID SUBMITTAL AND FORM:

In order to receive consideration, Contractor's bids shall be in accordance with the following:

- A. Sealed proposals shall be received in accordance with Public Advertisement as required by law, a copy of said notice being attached hereto and made a part of these specifications.
- B. Bids shall be made upon the forms provided hereafter, properly executed and with all the items filled out. Do not change the wording of the Bid Form and do not add words to the wording of the Bid Form. Unauthorized conditions, limitations, or provisions attached to the proposal shall be cause for rejection of the proposal. Alterations by erasure or interlineation must be explained or noted in the bid over the signature of the Bidder. All blank spaces must be filled in, with both words and number figures if requested. Ink or typewritten required, no pencil. Proposals on forms other than herewith provided will be rejected.
- C. No telegraphic bid or telegraphic modification of a bid will be considered. No bids received after the time fixed for receiving them will be considered. Late bids will be returned to the Bidder unopened.
- D. The Parking Authority shall not assume responsibility for bids forwarded by mail. It is the individual's responsibility to see that bids are presented to the Parking Authority on the hour and at the place designated.
- E. Each bid shall be addressed to the Parking Authority of the City of Camden (PACC) and shall be delivered to the PACC's office under the conditions set forth in the Invitation to Bid. The bid shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope bearing title of the Work, the name of the Bidder, and date and hour of opening. It is the responsibility of the Bidder to ensure that their bid is submitted by the proper time.
- F. Bids will be opened at the time and place set forth in the Notice to Bidders. Every bid received shall be opened and publicly read aloud. Bidders and other persons properly interested may be present in person or by representative but are not required to attend. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. Conditional bids will not be accepted.

#### III. BONDS:

- A. Bonds shall be required as provided in these Bid Documents All Bonds shall be issued and executed by Surety Companies licensed to do business in the State of New Jersey and acceptable to the Owner.
- B. Each bidder must deposit with his bid, a Bid Bond or Security in the form of a Bank Certified or Cashier's Check in the Name of the Camden Parking Authority, in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the Lump Sum Base Bid. Security shall be returned to unsuccessful Bidder's upon contract award and to the successful Bidder upon receipt of the Contractor's Performance Bond.

C. Prior to signing the contract, the Owner will require the selected Contractor to secure and post a Performance Bond and a Payment Bond where Bidder intends to use a subcontractor, each in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the Contract Sum.

#### IV. EXAMINATION OF DRAWINGS, SPECIFICATIONS AND SITES

A. In addition, each bidder is fully responsible for carefully examining the drawings, specifications and all other contract documents. Each Bidder shall fully inform himself prior to bidding as to all existing conditions and limitations under which the Work as set forth is to be accomplished. The submission of a bid shall be construed as conclusive evidence that the Bidder has made such examination.

#### V. WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- A. Any Bidder may withdraw his bid, either personally of by written request at any time prior to the scheduled time for opening of bids.
- B. No Bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of sixty (60) days after the date set for the opening of thereof, and all bids shall be subject to exceptions by the Owner during this period.

#### VI. AWARD OR REJECTION OF BIDS

A. The contract, if awarded, will be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible Bidder, subject to the Owner's right to reject any and all bids and to waive any informality in the bids or bidding.

#### VII. EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT

- A. The form of Agreement, which the successful Bidder, as Contractor, will be required to execute is included in the Contract Documents and must be carefully examined by each Bidder.
- B. The Bidder to whom the Contract is awarded by the Owner shall, within seven (7) days after notice of award and receipt of Agreement forms from the Owner, sign and deliver to the Owner all required copies of the Agreement.
- C. At or prior to delivery of the signed Agreement, the Contractor shall deliver to the Owner the Performance Bond and Payment Bond (if a subcontractor is used by Contractor) as well as the insurance certificates as required by the contract Documents. All bonds and certificates of insurance shall be approved by the Owner before the successful Bidder may proceed with the work.
- D. Failure or refusal to furnish bonds or insurance certificates in the form satisfactory to the Owner shall subject the Bidder to loss of time from the allowable construction period equal to the time of delay in furnishing the required material.

#### VIII. INTERPRETATION OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS PRIOR TO BIDDING:

- A. - D. The person submitting the request will be responsible for its prompt delivery.
- E. Any interpretation or correction of the Contract Documents will be made only by Addendum and will be emailed or fax delivered to each Bidder on record by <u>June 22, 2023 by 12:00 PM (Noon)</u>. Addendums will be posted to the PACC website. The Owner will not be responsible for any other explanations or interpretations of the contract Documents.

#### IX. NON-COLLUSION AFFIDAVIT:

- A. Each Bidder submitting a Bid for the work contemplated within the Contract Documents shall attach to his bid an executed copy of the Non-Collusion Affidavit (sample attached hereinafter), which in effect states that he has not entered into a collusive agreement with any person, firm, or corporation in regard to any bid submitted.
- B. Before executing any subcontract (if required), the Contractor shall submit the name of the proposed subcontractor for prior approval by the Executive Director.

#### X. STATEMENT OF BIDDER'S QUALIFICATIONS:

- A. Each Bidder shall submit to the Owner along with his Bid Proposal a statement of his qualifications. (Bid Qualification Form is attached hereinafter).
- B. All pertinent data requested must be filled in since the Bidder's qualifications will be a factor in awarding the Contract.
- C. The Camden Parking Authority may make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the Bidder to perform the work and verify all information called for in the Bidder Disclosure Statement (See Sections 9 & 10). The Camden Parking Authority reserves the right to reject any bid if evidence is revealed during an investigation of Bidder which indicates the bidder is not properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to complete the work or furnish the materials and supplies herein contemplated within the specified time.

#### **XI. COMPLETION TIME:**

- A. The time required for completing the work will be a factor in the awarding of the contract. The successful bidder shall be required to start the work within seven (7) days of receiving "Notice to Proceed" and to diligently pursue completion within sixty (60) days.
- B. The bidder recognizes that work may need to be completed after normal business hours and on weekends. Schedule and price should reflect this.
- C. Failure of the Contractor to have the work completed as stipulated would cause the Owner to suffer a loss that is difficult and expensive to accurately compute. In order to avoid such expense and difficulty, the Contractor shall pay to the Owner Two Hundred & Fifty Dollars (\$250) per day for each and every day, including weekends and holidays, after the determined day for completion, during or upon which said day the said work remains incomplete and unfurnished, not as a penalty, but as liquidated actual losses which the Owner shall suffer. Any sum which may be due for such losses shall be deducted and retained by the Owner from any balance which may be due the Contractor when the said work shall have been finished. The accepted Bidder will be required to provide a sufficient labor force to assure a satisfactory progress for the Work of this Contract. Time is of the essence. All work shall be fully completed within sixty (60) days of receipt of "Notice to Proceed".

#### XII. LUMP SUM PRICE:

A. The obligations of the Owner under the Contract shall be based upon a firm lump sum price. The contractor shall assume all increases in labor rates and/or site costs in order to determine progress payments.

#### XIII. PROGRESS PAYMENTS

- A. Payment shall be made upon execution of payment requisition form and certificate of payment by Contractor and approval of the CCPA Board of Commissioners.
- B. All certificates shall be reviewed by Owner's Engineering Firm and submitted to Owner upon approval by said Engineer.
- C. All payments shall be calculated at less five percent of the work completed during invoice period. This retained amount shall be held until the final payment.

#### IX. TIME AND MANNER

A. All work shall be performed strictly in accordance with the provisions as set forth hereinafter (refer to Specific Conditions).

#### X. NOT TO SUBLET OR ASSIGN

A. The Contractor shall constantly give its personal attention to the faithful execution of the Work, shall keep the same under its personal control, shall not assign the Contract or sublet the Work or any part thereof without the previous written consent of the Owner, and shall not assign any of the monies payable under the Contract, or his claim thereto, unless by and with like written consent of the Owner, and the Surety on the Contract Bonds. Any assignments or subletting in violation thereof shall be void and unenforceable.

#### XI. COMPLIANCE WITH ALL FEDERAL & STATE STATUTES:

A. The Bidders shall be required to comply with all laws, provisions, and requirements of all Federal and State Statutes and Municipal Ordinances applicable, and the bidders' particular attention is called to the following Revised Statutes of New Jersey: N.J.S.A. 52:33-1 to 52:33-4 (Preference for Domestic Products), R.S. 34:9-1 (Employment of Aliens Forbidden): R.S. 34:0-2 (resident Citizens to be preferred in employment) and the Sections dealing with Worker's Compensation, Child Labor and Fair Employment Practices.

#### XII. PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION ACT

A. The Public Works Contractor Registration Act, NJSA 34:11-56.48 et. seq., took effect on April 11, 2000. This act covers all public buildings open to and used by the general public or a public institution as well as all prevailing wage work. The act requires all prospective contractors, subcontractors, and sub-subcontractors to register with the Department of Labor. Prior to the Award of a Contract a NJ Business Certificate must be submitted to Owner by the successful bidder.

#### XIII. AFFIDAVIT OF FOREIGN CORPORATIONS:

A. Each bidder who is not chartered under the laws of the State of New Jersey, must submit with his bid an affidavit duly executed by the President, Vice President, or General Manager of the Corporation, stating in said affidavit that said corporation has, in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, obtained a certificate authorizing it to do business in the State of New Jersey. Each bidder must also, in his proposal state the name and address of the local representative, agent or proposal state the name and address of the local representative, agent or counsel representing said Corporation, upon whom service of process can be made.

#### XIV. QUALITY OF EQUIPMENT:

A. The Bidder warrants to the Camden Parking Authority that all materials and supplies to be furnished to the City shall be as specified, of merchantable quality, free from faults and defect, and for any particular purpose or use which may be set forth in specifications. Any and all work performed by successful bidder shall be done in a professional and quality manner.

#### XV. CONTRACTOR'S INSURANCE:

- A. Required Insurance. The CONTRACTOR shall purchase and maintain the Required Insurance specified in this Article to provide protection from claims for bodily injury, including death, and property damage which may arise out of or result from CONTRACTOR's performance of the Work and CONTRACTOR's other obligations under the Contract Documents, whether by CONTRACTOR, by any Subcontractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable:
  - (i) Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with Applicable Law, and Employers' Liability Insurance in accordance with Applicable Law and with a limit of liability of no less than \$1,000,000.00 per project for each accident.
  - (ii) Commercial General Liability Insurance on an occurrence basis, covering bodily injury and property damage in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 per project for each occurrence, including (a) contractor's protective liability coverage, (b) contractual liability covering the indemnification obligations of **CONTRACTOR** pursuant to the Contract Documents, (c) personal injury liability coverage and broad form property damage, (d) false arrest coverage, and (e) completed operations coverage.
  - (iii) Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance on an occurrence basis, covering all owned, non-owned and hired automobiles and other vehicles used by **CONTRACTOR** with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000.00 per project for each occurrence.
  - (iv) Excess liability insurance with a combined bodily injury and property damage limit of at least \$3,000,000.00 per project, excess of primary CGL Automobile and Employer's Liability.
  - (v) If applicable, the **CONTRACTOR** shall also be insured in the minimum limits required by the Motor Carrier Act of 1980.
  - (vi) The **CONTRACTOR**'s insurance policy will name the Parking Authority of the City of Camden as additional insured.

#### XVI. SPECIFICATIONS:

A. The specifications are attached hereto. If Bidder's proposal deviates from the specifications attached hereto the bid will be considered provided that the quality of the goods or services is equivalent to the specified goods or services and is deemed suitable to the needs of the Owner. All such deviations must be clearly listed as: "EXCEPTION TO SPECIFICATIONS".

When hiring or scheduling workers in each construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to employ minority and women workers in each construction trade consistent with the applicable employment goal prescribed by N.J.A.C. 17:27-7.3; provided, however, that the Division may, in its discretion, exempt a contractor or subcontractor from compliance with the good faith procedures prescribed by the following provisions, A, B and C, as long as the Division is satisfied that the contractor or subcontractor is employing workers provided by a union which provides evidence, in accordance with standards prescribed by the Division, that its percentage of active "card carrying" members who are minority and women workers is equal to or greater than the applicable employment goal established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-7.3. The contractor or subcontractor agrees that a good faith effort shall include compliance with the following procedures:

- (A) If the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for a construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor shall, within three business days of the contract award, seek assurances from the union that it will cooperate with the contractor or subcontractor as it fulfills its affirmative action obligations under this contract and in accordance with the rules promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq., as supplemented and amended from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act. If the contractor or subcontractor is unable to obtain said assurances from the construction trade union at least five business days prior to the commencement of construction work, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to attempt to hire or schedule minority and women workers directly, consistent with the applicable employment goal. If the contractor's or subcontractor's prior experience with a construction trade union, regardless of whether the union has provided said assurances, indicates a significant possibility that the trade union will not refer sufficient minority and women workers consistent with the applicable employment goal, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to be prepared to hire or schedule minority and women workers directly, consistent with the applicable employment goal, by complying with the hiring or scheduling procedures prescribed under (B) below; and the contractor or subcontractor further agrees to take said action immediately if it determines or is so notified by the Division that the union is not referring minority and women workers consistent with the applicable employment goal.
- (B) If the hiring or scheduling of a workforce consistent with the employment goal has not or cannot be achieved for each construction trade by adhering to the procedures of (A) above, or if the contractor does not have a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for a construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to take the following actions consistent with the applicable county employment goals:
  - (l) To notify the public agency compliance officer, the Division, and minority and women referral organizations listed by the Division pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.3, of its workforce needs, and request referral of minority and women workers.
  - (2) To notify any minority and women workers who have been listed with it as awaiting available vacancies:
  - (3) Prior to commencement of work, to request that the local construction trade union refer minority and women workers to fill job openings, provided the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for the construction trade;
  - (4) To leave standing requests for additional referral to minority and women workers with the local construction trade union, provided the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for the construction trade, the State Training and Employment Service and other approved referral sources in the area until such time as the workforce is consistent with the employment goal;
  - (5) If it is necessary to lay off some of the workers in a given trade on the construction site, to assure, consistent with the applicable State and Federal statutes and court decisions, that sufficient minority and women employees remain on the site consistent with the employment goal; and to employ any minority and women workers laid off by the contractor on any other construction site on which its workforce composition is not consistent with an employment goal established pursuant to rules implementing N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq.;
  - (6) To adhere to the following procedure when minority and women workers apply or are referred to the contractor or subcontractor:

- (i) If said individuals have never previously received any document or certification signifying a level of qualification lower than that required in order to perform the work of the construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor shall determine the qualifications of such individuals and if the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce in each construction trade is not consistent with the applicable employment goal, it shall hire or schedule those individuals who satisfy appropriate qualification standards. However, a contractor or subcontractor shall determine that the individual at least possesses the requisite skills, and experience recognized by a union, apprentice program or a referral agency, provided the referral agency is acceptable to the Division. If necessary, the contractor or subcontractor shall hire or schedule minority and women workers who qualify as trainees pursuant to these rules. All of the requirements, however, are limited by the provisions of (C) below.
- (ii) If the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce is consistent with the applicable employment goal, the name of any interested women or minority individual shall be maintained on a waiting list for the first consideration, in the event the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce is no longer consistent with the applicable employment goal.
- (iii) If, for any reason, said contractor or subcontractor determines that a minority individual or a woman is not qualified or if the individual qualifies as an advanced trainee or apprentice, the contractor or subcontractor shall inform the individual in writing of the reasons for the determination, maintain a copy of the determination in its files, and send a copy to the public agency compliance officer and to the Division.
- (7) To keep a complete and accurate record of all requests made for the referral of workers in any trade covered by the contract, on forms made available by the Division and submitted promptly to the Division upon request.
- (C) The contractor or subcontractor agrees that nothing contained in (B) above shall preclude the contractor or subcontractor from complying with the union hiring hall or apprenticeship policies in any applicable collective bargaining agreement or union hiring hall arrangement, and, where required by custom or agreement, it shall send journeymen and trainees to the union for referral, or to the apprenticeship program for admission, pursuant to such agreement or arrangement. 

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq.**, as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

When hiring or scheduling workers in each construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to employ minority and women workers in each construction trade consistent with the applicable employment goal prescribed by **N.J.A.C. 17:27-7.3**; provided, however, that the Division may, in its discretion, exempt a contractor or subcontractor from compliance with the good faith procedures prescribed by the following provisions, A, B and C, as long as the Division is satisfied that the contractor or subcontractor is employing workers provided by a union which provides evidence, in accordance with standards prescribed by the Division, that its percentage of active "card carrying" members who are minority and women workers is equal to or greater than the applicable employment goal established in accordance with **N.J.A.C. 17:27-7.3**.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees that a good faith effort shall include compliance with the following procedures:

(A) If the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for a construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor shall, within three business days of the contract award, seek assurances from the union that it will cooperate with the contractor or subcontractor as it fulfills its affirmative action obligations under this contract and in accordance with the rules promulgated by the

Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq., as supplemented and amended from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act. If the contractor or subcontractor is unable to obtain said assurances from the construction trade union at least five business days prior to the commencement of construction work, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to attempt to hire or schedule minority and women workers directly, consistent with the applicable employment goal. If the contractor's or subcontractor's prior experience with a construction trade union, regardless of whether the union has provided said assurances, indicates a significant possibility that the trade union will not refer sufficient minority and women workers consistent with the applicable employment goal, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to be prepared to hire or schedule minority and women workers directly, consistent with the applicable employment goal, by complying with the hiring or scheduling procedures prescribed under (B) below; and the contractor or subcontractor further agrees to take said action immediately if it determines or is so notified by the Division that the union is not referring minority and women workers consistent with the applicable employment goal.

- (B) If the hiring or scheduling of a workforce consistent with the employment goal has not or cannot be achieved for each construction trade by adhering to the procedures of (A) above, or if the contractor does not have a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for a construction trade, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to take the following actions consistent with the applicable county employment goals:
- (1) To notify the public agency compliance officer, the Division, and minority and women referral organizations listed by the Division pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.3, of its workforce needs, and request referral of minority and women workers;
- (2) To notify any minority and women workers who have been listed with it as awaiting available vacancies;
- (3) Prior to commencement of work, to request that the local construction trade union refer minority and women workers to fill job openings, provided the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for the construction trade;
- (4) To leave standing requests for additional referral to minority and women workers with the local construction trade union, provided the contractor or subcontractor has a referral agreement or arrangement with a union for the construction trade, the State Training and Employment Service and other approved referral sources in the area until such time as the workforce is consistent with the employment goal;
- (5) If it is necessary to lay off some of the workers in a given trade on the construction site, to assure, consistent with the applicable State and Federal statutes and court decisions, that sufficient minority and women employees remain on the site consistent with the employment goal; and to employ any minority and women workers so laid off by the contractor on any other construction site on which its workforce composition is not

consistent with an employment goal established pursuant to rules implementing N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et. seq.;

- (6) To adhere to the following procedure when minority and women workers apply or are referred to the contractor or subcontractor:
- (i) If said individuals have never previously received any document or certification signifying a level of qualification lower than that required in order to perform the work of the construction trade, the

contractor or subcontractor shall determine the qualifications of such individuals and if the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce in each construction trade is not consistent with the applicable employment goal; it shall hire or schedule those individuals who satisfy appropriate qualification standards. However, a contractor or subcontractor shall determine that the individual at least possesses the requisite skills, and experience recognized by a union, apprentice program or a referral agency, provided the referral agency is acceptable to the Division. If necessary, the contractor or subcontractor shall hire or schedule minority and women workers who qualify as trainees pursuant to these rules. All of the requirements, however, are limited by the provisions of (C) below.

- (ii) If the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce is consistent with the applicable employment goal, the name of any interested women or minority individual shall be maintained on a waiting list for the first consideration, in the event the contractor's or subcontractor's workforce is no longer consistent with the applicable employment goal.
- (iii) If, for any reason, said contractor or subcontractor determines that a minority individual or a woman is not qualified or if the individual qualifies as an advanced trainee or apprentice, the contractor or subcontractor shall inform the individual in writing of the reasons for the determination, maintain a copy of the determination in its files, and send a copy to the public agency compliance officer and to the Division.
- (7) To keep a complete and accurate record of all requests made for the referral of workers in any trade covered by the contract, on forms made available by the Division and submitted promptly to the Division upon request.
- (C) The contractor or subcontractor agrees that nothing contained in (B) above shall preclude the contractor or subcontractor from complying with the union hiring hall or apprenticeship policies in any applicable collective bargaining agreement or union hiring hall arrangement, and, where required by custom or agreement, it shall send journeymen and trainees to the union for referral, or to the apprenticeship program for admission, pursuant to such agreement or arrangement. However, where the practices of a union or apprenticeship program will result in the exclusion of minorities and women or the failure to refer minorities and women consistent with the county employment goal, the contractor or subcontractor shall consider for employment persons referred pursuant to (B) above without regard to such agreement or arrangement; provided further, however, that the contractor or subcontractor shall not be required to employ women and minority advanced trainees and trainees in numbers which result in the employment of advanced trainees and trainees as a percentage of the total workforce for the construction trade, which percentage significantly exceeds the apprentice to journey worker ratio specified in the applicable collective bargaining agreement, or in the absence of a collective bargaining agreement, exceeds the ratio established by practice in the area for said construction trade. Also, the contractor or subcontractor agrees that, in implementing the procedures of (B) above it shall, where applicable, employ minority and women workers residing within the geographical jurisdiction of the union.

After notification of award, but prior to signing a construction contract, the contractor shall submit to the public agency compliance officer and the Division an initial project workforce report (Form AA 201) provided to the public agency by the Division for distribution to and completion by the contractor, in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-7.3

The contractor also agrees to submit a copy of the Monthly Project Workforce Report once a month thereafter for the duration of this contract to the Division and to the public agency compliance officer.

The contractor agrees to cooperate with the public agency in the payment of budgeted funds, as is necessary, for on-the-job and/or off-the-job programs for outreach and training of minorities and women.

(D). The contractor and its subcontractors shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Contract Compliance & EEO as may be requested by the Division from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Contract Compliance & EEO for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27.

Subject to the applicable provisions of the law, this Contract shall be in full force and effect as a contract from and after the date when a fully executed and approved counterpart hereof is delivered to the Contractor.

# 1. SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this contract consists of furnishing all materials, equipment, supplies, labor and transportation, including fuel, power, water and performing all work as required in the Statement of Work in the contract, in strict accordance with the specifications, schedules and drawings, all of which are made a part hereof, and including such detail drawings as may be furnished by the ENGINEER from time to time during the prosecution of the work in explanation of said drawings.

# 2. CHARACTER OF WORK AND MECHANICS

The work shall be executed in the best and most workmanlike manner by qualified, careful and efficient mechanics in strict accordance with the drawings and specifications.

# 3. <u>SITE INVESTIGATION</u>

The Contractor acknowledges that he has satisfied himself as to the nature and location of the work, the general and local conditions, including but not restricted to those bearing upon transportation, disposal, handling and storage of materials, availability of labor, water, electric power, roads and uncertainties of weather, river stages, tides or similar physical conditions at the site, the conformation and conditions of the ground, the character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the prosecution of the work. The Contractor further acknowledges that he has satisfied himself as to the character, quality and quantity of surface and subsurface materials or obstacles to be encountered insofar as this information is reasonably ascertainable from an inspection of the site, including all exploratory work done by the ENGINEER, as well as from information presented by the drawings and specifications made a part of this contract. Any failure by the Contractor to acquaint himself with the available information will not relieve him from responsibility for estimating properly the difficulty or cost of successfully performing the work. The OWNER assumes no responsibility for any conclusions or interpretations made by the Contractor on the basis of the information made available by the ENGINEER. The OWNER also assumes no responsibility for any understanding or representations made by its officers or agents during or prior to the execution of this contract, unless (1) such understanding or representations are expressly stated in the contract, and (2) the contract expressly provides that the responsibility therefore is assumed by the OWNER representations.

# 4. <u>OPERATIONS AND STORAGE AREAS</u>

- a. All operations of the Contractor (including storage of materials) shall be confined to areas approved by the ENGINEER. No unauthorized or unwarranted entry upon or passage through, or storage or disposal of materials shall be made upon private premises. The Contractor shall be liable for any and all damage caused by him to such private premises. The Contractor shall hold and save the OWNER, ENGINEER and their officers and agents free and harmless from liability of any nature or kind arising from any use, trespass or damage occasioned by his operations on premises of third persons.
- b. Temporary buildings (storage sheds, shops, offices, etc.) may be erected by the Contractor only with the approval of the ENGINEER, and shall be built with labor and materials furnished by the Contractor without expense to the OWNER. Such temporary buildings and/or utilities shall remain the property of the Contractor and will be removed by him at his expense upon the completion of the work. With the written consent of the ENGINEER, such buildings and/or utilities may be abandoned and need not be removed.
- c. The Contractor shall, under regulations prescribed by the ENGINEER, use only established roadways or construct and use such temporary roadways as may be approved by the ENGINEER. Where materials are transported in the prosecution of the work, vehicles shall not be loaded beyond the loading capacity recommended by the manufacturer of the vehicle or prescribed by any federal, state or local law or regulation. When it is necessary to cross curbings or sidewalks, protection against damage shall be provided by the Contractor, and any damaged roads, curbings or sidewalks shall be repaired by, or at the expense of, the Contractor.

# 5. PROGRESS CHARTS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR OVERTIME WORK

- a. The Contractor shall, within five (5) days after date of notice to proceed, prepare and submit to the ENGINEER for approval a practical schedule showing the date on which he will start the several salient features (including procurement of materials, plant and equipment) and the contemplated dates for completing same.
- b. If, in the opinion of the ENGINEER, the Contractor falls behind the progress schedule, the Contractor shall take such steps as may be necessary to improve his progress, and the ENGINEER may require him to increase days of work, and to submit for approval such supplementary schedule or schedules in chart form as may be deemed necessary to demonstrate the manner in which the agreed rate of progress will be regained, all without additional cost to the OWNER.

c. Failure of the Contractor to comply with the requirements of the ENGINEER under the provision shall be grounds for determination by the ENGINEER that the Contractor is not prosecuting the work with such diligence as will ensure completion within the time specified. Upon such determination, the ENGINEER may terminate the Contractor's right to proceed with the work, or any separable part thereof, in accordance with the delays - damage clause of the contract.

# 6. <u>SUBCONTRACTORS</u>

Within seven (7) days after the award of any subcontract, the Contractor shall deliver to the ENGINEER a statement setting forth the name and address of the subcontractor. If for sufficient reason, at any time during the progress of the work, the ENGINEER and OWNER determine that any subcontractor is undesirable, they will notify the Contractor accordingly and immediate steps will be taken for cancellation of such subcontract. Subletting by subcontractors shall be subject to the same regulations. Nothing contained in this contract shall create any contractual relation between the subcontractor and the OWNER and/or ENGINEER.

# 7. QUALITY OF ARTICLES, MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

- a. Articles, materials and equipment to be incorporated into the work under the contract shall be new and unused unless otherwise specified; and where required to conform to standard specifications of the ENGINEER or other authorities incorporated by reference, will conform to the respective editions, including amendments specified; or where the editions are not specified, will conform to the editions, including amendments in effect on the date of the Invitation for Bids.
- b. Any samples and descriptive data required shall:
  - 1. Be submitted within the time specified in these specifications, or, if no time be specified, within a reasonable time before use to permit inspection and testing.
  - 2. Be shipped, prepaid and delivered, as specified in these specifications, or as directed by the ENGINEER.
  - 3. Be properly marked to show the name of the material, trade name of manufacturer, place of origin, name and location of the project where the material represented by the sample is to be used, and the name of the contractor submitting the sample.
- c. Samples not subject to destructive tests may be retained until the completion of the work, but thereafter will be returned to the Contractor, if he so requests, in writing, at his own expense. Failure of any sample to pass the specified requirements will be sufficient cause for refusal to consider further any sample from the same manufacturer whose material failed to pass the tests.

# 8. PROTECTION OF MATERIAL AND WORK

The Contractor shall at all times protect and preserve all materials, supplies and equipment of every description (including property which may be OWNER furnished or owned) and all work performed. All reasonable requests of the ENGINEER to enclose or specially protect such property shall be complied with. If, as determined by the ENGINEER, material, equipment, supplies and work performed are not adequately protected by the Contractor, such property may be protected by the OWNER and the cost thereof may be charged to the Contractor or deducted from any payments due to him.

# 9. PROTECTION OF VEGETATION

- a. The Contractor will preserve and protect all existing vegetation such as trees, shrubs and grass on or adjacent to the site which do not unreasonably interfere with the construction as may be determined by the ENGINEER. The Contractor will be responsible for all unauthorized cutting or damaging of trees and shrubs, including damage due to careless operation of equipment, stockpiling of materials, or tracking of grass areas by equipment.
- b. Care will be taken by the Contractor in felling trees authorized for removal to avoid any unnecessary damage to vegetation that is to remain in place. Any limbs or branches of trees broken during such operations shall be trimmed with a clean cut and painted with an approved tree pruning compound. The Contractor will be liable for or may be required to replace or restore at his own expense, all vegetation destroyed or damaged.
- c. Protect existing structures and other property at site or adjacent thereto, including walks, pavements and roadways.
- d. Promptly remedy all damage or loss, at no expense to the Owner.

# 10. POSSESSION PRIOR TO COMPLETION

The OWNER shall have the right to take possession of or use any completed or partially completed part of the work. Such possession or use shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work not completed in accordance with the contract. If such prior possession or use by the OWNER delays the progress of the work or causes additional expenses to the Contractor, an equitable adjustment in the contract price and/or the time of completion will be made and the contract shall be modified in writing accordingly.

# 11. SUSPENSION OF WORK

The ENGINEER may order the Contractor to suspend all or any part of the work for such period of time as may be determined by them to be necessary or desirable for convenience of the OWNER. Unless such suspension unreasonably delays the progress of the work and

causes additional expense to the Contractor, no increase in contract price will be allowed. In the case of suspension of all or any part of the work for an unreasonable length of time, causing additional expense not due to the fault or negligence of the Contractor, the ENGINEER shall make an adjustment in the contract price in the amount of the additional proper expense and modify the contract accordingly. An extension of time for the completion of the work in the event of any such suspension will be allowed the Contractor, providing, however, that the suspension was not due to the fault or negligence of the Contractor.

# 12. CLEANING UP

The Contractor shall at all times keep the construction area, including storage areas used by him, free from accumulations of waste materials or rubbish and prior to completion of the work remove the rubbish from the premises. Upon completion of the construction, the Contractor shall leave the work and premises in a clean, neat and workmanlike condition satisfactory to the ENGINEER.

#### 13. BONDS

- a. Performance and Maintenance Bonds. The Contractor shall furnish a performance and maintenance bond with good and sufficient surety or sureties acceptable to the OWNER in connection with the performance of the work under this Agreement. The penal sum of such performance and maintenance bonds will be one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price. After completion and acceptance of all work, the maintenance bond shall remain in effect for a two (2) year period as guarantee against latent defects.
- b. Any bonds required hereunder will be dated as of the same date as the contract and will be furnished by the Contractor to the OWNER at the time the contract is executed, and must be accompanied by a Power of Attorney Certificate and Financial Statement.

#### 14. INSPECTION

The work is subject to inspection to ensure strict compliance with the terms of the contract. No inspector is authorized to change any provision of the specifications without written authorization of the ENGINEER, nor shall the presence or absence of an inspector relieve the Contractor from any requirements of the contract. As soon as practicable after the completion of the entire work, or any divisible part thereof as may be designated in these specifications, an examination thereof will be made by the ENGINEER at the site of the work. If such work is found to comply fully with the requirements of the contract, it will be accepted, and final payment therefore will be made in accordance with the clause of the contract entitled, "Payments to Contractors."

# 15. <u>INSTALLATION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE MANUALS</u>

Upon completion of all work the Contractors will furnish six (6) copies of Record Data and Installation, Operation and Maintenance Manuals for all Mechanical and Electrical Equipment. Maintenance Manuals shall include complete wiring diagrams, normal causes of failures and how to remedy them, with complete instructions on maintenance of equipment. Delivery of these manuals will be made to the ENGINEER prior to submittal of semi-final estimate for payment by the Contractor.

# 1.ON-SITE CONDITIONS

Meet following conditions during the progress of contract as specified in the New Jersey Department of Transportation Standard Specifications, 1989, or as currently amended.

- a. Public Safety and Convenience Section 107.11
- b. Sanitary, Health and Safety Provisions Section 107.10
- c. Final Clean Up Section 104.11
- d. Equipment Sections 101.03 and 105.18

#### 2.UTILITIES

Adhere to Section 105.09 of Standard Specifications regarding location of and construction around public utilities, including those publicly and privately owned.

Permit owners of utilities, or their agents, access to site work at all times, in order to relocate or protect their facilities. Cooperate and coordinate with utility owners in performing this work.

Notify utility owners not less than ten (10) days in advance of any work that will endanger or affect their facilities.

Separate payment will not be made for protection and preservation of utilities and cooperation and coordination with their owners. Include all such costs in unit price bid for the various items of contract as listed in Proposal.

Contact the following a minimum of ten (10) days prior to construction:

"One Number to Call System": (800) 272-1000

The Contractor is advised that the "One Number to Call System" Service noted above does not necessarily include all utilities in the construction area. Some utility companies (for example, New Jersey-American Water Company) may require separate notification.

# 3. RESPONSIBILITIES REGARDING EXISTING UTILITIES, PIPES AND STRUCTURES

Existence and location of utilities, pipes and structures shall be investigated and verified in field by Contractor before starting work.

Contractor shall be held responsible for any damages to and for protection of all existing utilities and structures.

#### **4.STORING OF MATERIALS**

All materials required in the work may be stored on site subject to approval by the ENGINEER. All such materials, tools, and machinery stored upon public thoroughfares shall be provided with approved warning lights or other devices to protect pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

#### 5. WATER SUPPLY

Provide all water for construction purposes, including expense of having water conveyed about the work, in prices stipulated for various items of the work under this contract. The source, quality and quantity of water furnished shall at all times be satisfactory to ENGINEER.

Connection to existing fire hydrant may be utilized for construction. Contractor to obtain water meter from Camden City public works department at Contractor's expense and water paid for by Contractor.

#### 6.PRECONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

A Preconstruction Conference will be held at the office of the ENGINEER or at the construction site, at the discretion of the ENGINEER. The ENGINEER will notify the Contractor of date and time.

# 7. COMMUNICATIONS

Forward all communications to OWNER through ENGINEER.

#### 8. MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

Provide for maintenance and protection of traffic as specified in Section 110.01 of the Standard Specifications.

Place and maintain a minimum of three (3) specified lights at such locations as are necessary to call attention of oncoming traffic to the existence of a danger area. Space warning lights maximum of 100 feet to define edge of usable pavement through construction areas.

Before beginning work on any phase of the project, furnish and install all specified construction signs, barricades, wood traffic guides, lights and other devices necessary to protect the public during construction.

Erect and maintain signs in substantial manner and maintain to provide maximum visibility and legibility at all times. Erect and maintain traffic control devices in accordance with Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, current edition.

Establish, repair, replace and relocate signs, lights, warning and protective services as required.

Employ competent, trained and uniformed traffic directors at every point where equipment is working immediately adjacent to or is entering, leaving or crossing active traffic lanes. Employ traffic directors continuously for full time such conditions exist as necessary.

Do not permit equipment or machinery having Caterpillar or other heavy treads that mar or damage pavements to move over or to operate from newly constructed or existing pavement unless such equipment or machinery is moved on suitable pontoons or trailers.

Repair any damage to newly constructed or existing pavements as approved by ENGINEER, at Contractor's expense, or repair will be made by others and cost of such repairs will be charged against Contractor.

Any restriction or diversion of traffic at any time shall be subject to approval of the Local Police Department. In accordance with the Laws of 1983, c.84, the Contractor shall give seventy-two (72) hours notice (by the erection and maintenance of signs near the affected area) whenever a township road must be closed to vehicular traffic for a period of forty-eight (48) hours or more. In case of emergency, "every effort shall be made to notify the public as soon as possible of the closing." Notify Municipal Police and Fire Departments at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to closing of any roadway to traffic.

Submit within ten (10) days after Notice to Proceed, a plan of methods, facilities and devices for maintenance and protection of highway traffic.

Do not occupy with equipment, materials or personnel any roadway or sidewalk areas within or adjacent to the project that is open to traffic except as necessary during actual working hours.

Provide means of access for pedestrian and vehicular traffic at all private driveways and occupied buildings affected by the work of this contract. During construction in the vicinity of driveways, access width at driveway entrance shall be plainly marked by lights, and other devices as necessary. Notify owners of adjoining properties at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to beginning any work which will interfere with their passage.

# 9. EXECUTION, CORRELATION AND INTENT OF DOCUMENTS

The Contract Documents as defined in the General Provisions are complementary, and what is called for by any one shall be as binding as if called for by all.

# SPECIAL CONTRACT PROVISIONS FOR INVESTIGATING, REPORTING AND RESOLVING EMPLOYMENT DISCRIMINATION AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT COMPLAINTS

The contractor hereby agrees to the following requirements in order to implement fully the nondiscrimination provisions of the Supplemental Specifications.

The Contractor agrees that in instances when it receives from any person working on the project site a verbal or written complaint of employment discrimination, prohibited under N.J.S.A. 10:5-1 et seq., 10:2-1 et seq., 42 U.S.C. 2000(d) et seq., 42 U.S.C. 2000 (e) et seq. and Executive Order 11246, it shall take the following actions:

- 1. Within one (1) working day commence an investigation of the complaint which shall include but not be limited to interviewing the complainant, the respondent, and all possible witnesses to the alleged act or acts of discrimination or sexual harassment.
- 2. Prepare and keep for its use and file a detailed written investigative report which includes the following information:
  - a) Investigatory activities and findings.
  - b) Dates and parties involved and activities involved in resolving the complaint.
  - c) Resolution and corrective action taken if discrimination or sexual harassment is found to have taken place.
  - d) A signed copy of resolution of complaint by complainant and contractor.

In addition to keeping in its files the above-noted detailed written investigative report, the contractor shall keep for possible future review by the Department all other records, including but not limited to, interview memos and statements.

- 3. Upon the request of the Department, provides to the Department within ten (10) calendar days a copy of its detailed written investigative report and all other records on the complaint investigation and resolution.
- 4. Take appropriate disciplinary action against any contractor employee, official or agent who has committed acts of discrimination or sexual harassment against any contractor employee or person working on the project. If the person committing the discrimination is a subcontractor employee, then the contractor is required to attempt to effectuate corrective and/or disciplinary action by the subcontractor in order to establish compliance with project's contract requirements.
- 5. Take appropriate disciplinary action against any contractor employee, official or agent who retaliates, coerces or intimidates any complaint and/or person who provides information or assistance to any investigation of complaints of discrimination or sexual harassment. If the person retaliating, coercing or intimidating a complainant or other person assisting an investigation is a subcontractor's employee, then the contractor is required to attempt to effectuate corrective and/or disciplinary action by the subcontractor in order to establish compliance with the project's contract requirements.
- 6. Ensure toe the maximum extent possible that the privacy interests of all person who give confidential information in aid of the contractor's employment discrimination investigation are protected.

In conjunction with the above requirements, the contractor shall develop and post a written sexual harassment policy for its work force.

Failure by the contractor to comply with the above requirements may be cause for the New Jersey Department of Transportation to institute against the contractor any and all enforcement proceedings and/or sanctions authorized by the contract or by state and/or federal law.

# SECTION 015000 - TEMPORARY FACILITIES AND CONTROLS

#### PART 1 - GENERAL

#### 1.1 SUMMARY

- A. Section includes requirements for temporary utilities, support facilities, and security and protection facilities.
- B. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions apply to this Section.

# C. Related Requirements:

1. Section 011000 "Summary" for work restrictions and limitations on utility interruptions.

#### 1.2 USE CHARGES

- A. General: Installation and removal of and use charges for temporary facilities shall be included in the Contract Sum unless otherwise indicated. Allow other entities engaged in the Project to use temporary services and facilities without cost, including, but not limited to Owner's testing agencies, Engineer, and authorities having jurisdiction.
- B. Water Service: Pay water-service use charges for water used by all entities for construction operations. Contractor is responsible provide connections and extensions of services as required for construction operations. Connections are to be done in accordance with City of Camden and American Water requirements.
- C. Sewer Service: Pay sewer-service use charges for sewer usage by all entities for construction operations (includes any required dewatering). Contractor is responsible provide connections and extensions of services as required for construction operations. Connections are to be done in accordance with City of Camden and American Water requirements.
- D. Electric Power Service: Pay electric power service use charges for electricity used by all entities for construction operations. Contractor is responsible provide connections and extensions of services as required for construction operations. Connections are to be done in accordance with PSE&G requirements.

#### 1.3 INFORMATIONAL SUBMITTALS

A. Site Utilization Plan: Show temporary facilities, temporary utility lines and connections, staging areas, construction site entrances, vehicle circulation, and parking areas for construction personnel.

- B. Implementation and Termination Schedule: Within seven (7) days of date established for commencement of the Work, submit schedule indicating implementation and termination dates of each temporary utility.
- C. Project Identification and Temporary Signs: Show fabrication and installation details, including plans, elevations, details, layouts, typestyles, graphic elements, and message content (if required).
- D. Fire-Safety Program: Show compliance with requirements of NFPA 241 and authorities having jurisdiction. Indicate Contractor personnel responsible for management of fire-prevention program.
- E. Moisture-and Mold-Protection Plan: Describe procedures and controls for protecting materials and construction from water absorption and damage and mold.
- F. Dust- Control Plan: Submit coordination drawing and narrative that indicates the dust- control measures proposed for use, proposed locations, and proposed time frame for their operation. Include the following:
  - 1. Locations of dust-control partitions at each phase of work.
  - 2. Waste-handling procedures.
  - 3. Other dust-control measures.

# 1.4 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Electric Service: Comply with NECA, NEMA, and UL standards and regulations for temporary electric service. Install service to comply with NFPA 70.
- B. Tests and Inspections: Arrange for authorities having jurisdiction to test and inspect each temporary utility before use. Obtain required certifications and permits.
- C. Accessible Temporary Egress: Comply with applicable provisions in the United States Access Board's ADA-ABA Accessibility Guidelines and ICC/ANSI A117.1.

#### 1.5 PROJECT CONDITIONS

A. Temporary Use of Permanent Facilities: Engage Installer of each permanent service to assume responsibility for operation, maintenance, and protection of each permanent service during its use as a construction facility before Owner's acceptance, regardless of previously assigned responsibilities.

#### PART 2 - PRODUCTS

#### 2.1 MATERIALS

- A. Chain-Link Fencing: New materials or previously used chain link fencing in good condition. Minimum 2-inch, 0.148-inch thick, galvanized-steel, chain-link fabric fencing; minimum eight (8) feet high with galvanized-steel pipe posts; minimum 2-3/8-inch OD line posts and 2-7/8-inch OD corner and pull posts with 1-5/8-inch OD top rails. Post shall be suitable for setting in concrete footings, driving into ground, anchoring with base plates, or inserting in precast concrete blocks. Post spacing shall be 12 foot maximum if using prefabricated panels and 10 foot maximum if wire tying mesh to posts (if required).
- B. Portable Chain-Link Fencing: Minimum 2-inch, 0.148-inch thick, galvanized-steel, chain-link fabric fencing; minimum eight (8) feet high with galvanized-steel pipe posts; minimum 2-3/8-inch OD line posts and 2-7/8-inch OD corner and pull posts, with 1-5/8-inch OD top and bottom rails. Provide galvanized-steel bases for supporting posts (if required).
- C. Fencing Windscreen Privacy Screen: Polyester fabric scrim with grommets for attachment to chain-link fence, sized to height of fence, in color selected by Engineer from manufacturer's standard colors. 4.9 oz/sq. yd, Burst Strength: 210 psi. (If Required).
- D. Gates: Provide personnel and vehicle gates of the quantity and size required for functional access to site. Site access is to be off Hudson Street. Fabrication is same material as for fencing. Vehicle gates are to be a minimum of 20 feet to allow access for emergency vehicles. All gates are to be capable of manual operation by 1 person (if required).
- E. Installation of temporary fencing shall not deter or hinder access to fire hydrants. Maintain 3 feet diameter clearance around fire hydrants. Where fire hydrant is blocked by fencing, provide access gate.
- F. Drive posts, set in holes and backfill, or anchor in precast concrete blocks. For soft unstable ground conditions, cast concrete plug around post. Gate posts: use bracing or concrete footings to provide rigidity for accommodating size of gate.
- G. Maintain fencing in good condition. If damaged, contractor shall immediately repair at no additional cost to owner.
- H. Prior to acceptance of installed gates, demonstrate proper operation of gates under each possible open and close conditions. Adjust gate and latches to operate smoothly, easily, and quietly, free of binding, warp, excessive deflection, distortion, nonalignment, misplacement, disruption, or malfunction, throughout entire operation of project (if required).

# 2.2 EQUIPMENT

A. Fire Extinguishers: Portable, UL rated; with class and extinguishing agent as required by locations and classes of fire exposures.

#### **PART 3 - EXECUTION**

# 3.1 TEMPORARY FACILITIES, GENERAL

- A. Conservation: Coordinate construction and use of temporary facilities with consideration given to conservation of energy, water, and materials. Coordinate use of temporary utilities to minimize waste.
  - 1. Salvage materials and equipment involved in performance of, but not actually incorporated into, the Work. See other Sections for disposition of salvaged materials that are designated as Owner's property.

#### 3.2 INSTALLATION, GENERAL

- A. Locate facilities where they will serve Project adequately and result in minimum interference with performance of the Work. Relocate and modify facilities as required by progress of the Work.
  - 1. Locate facilities to limit site disturbance.
- B. Provide each facility ready for use when needed to avoid delay. Do not remove until facilities are no longer needed or are replaced by authorized use of completed permanent facilities.

#### 3.3 TEMPORARY UTILITY INSTALLATION

- A. General: Install temporary service or connect to existing service.
  - 1. Arrange with utility company, Owner, and existing users for time when service can be interrupted, if necessary, to make connections for temporary services.
- B. Temporary Heating and Cooling: Provide temporary heating and cooling required by construction activities for curing or drying of completed installations or for protecting installed construction from adverse effects of low temperatures or high humidity. Select equipment that will not have a harmful effect on completed installations or elements being installed.
  - 1. Provide temporary dehumidification systems when required to reduce ambient and substrate moisture levels to level required to allow installation or application of finishes and their proper curing or drying.
- C. Isolation of Work Areas in Occupied Facilities: Prevent dust, fumes, and odors from entering occupied areas.
- D. Electric Power Service: Provide electric power service and distribution system of sufficient size, capacity, and power characteristics required for construction operations.
  - 1. Install electric power service overhead unless otherwise indicated.

- E. Lighting: Provide temporary lighting with local switching that provides adequate illumination for construction operations, observations, inspections, and traffic conditions.
  - 1. Install and operate temporary lighting that fulfills security and protection requirements without operating entire system.

#### 3.4 TRAFFIC PROTECTION

#### A. Work Included

1. This work includes but is not limited to providing satisfactory barricades, safety fence, warning signs, detour signs, flashers, traffic cones, traffic barrels, flagmen, and all materials, equipment, and labor necessary for the acceptable maintenance and protection of traffic as outlined in New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) Publication entitled "Work Zone Traffic Control", as required by Camden County Police, City of Camden Fire Department, and as directed by the Engineer.

# B. General Requirements

- 1. Existing laws, ordinances, and regulations shall govern the parking, loading, and operation of trucks on existing highways or streets.
- 2. The Contractor shall maintain vehicular and pedestrian access to adjacent buildings and properties at all times during demolition, unless otherwise authorized. Contractor to submit detour plan to Owner and Engineer for review and approval, if required.
- 3. The Contractor shall monitor parking of construction personnel's vehicles and maintain vehicular access to and through the Project site.
- 4. The Contractor shall prevent construction-related parking on or adjacent to access streets or in non-designated areas.
- 5. The Contractor shall maintain access for emergency vehicles at all times during work.
- 6. All fire hydrants and water valves shall be protected but, in a manor, to be readily accessible for use
- 7. The Contractor shall provide suitable means for a safe site circulation path to accommodate pedestrian traffic.
- 8. The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of flagmen as required or as directed by the Engineer.
- 9. The Contractor shall be responsible for notifying the Camden County, Camden County Police, City of Camden School District, City of Camden Fire Department, Live Nation (Freedom Mortgage Pavilion), and Macedonia AME Church when permitted to close any street, or portion of any street, 36 hours prior to closure.
- 10. Maintenance and protection of traffic during construction operations shall conform to the New Jersey Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

# C. Special Requirements

1. The work area shall be properly barricaded and secured during non-work hours to prevent access by unauthorized personnel. This scope of the Contractor's work shall be coordinated with the Engineer.

- 2. The Contractor shall furnish, place, and maintain safety fence around all excavations and other areas designated by the Engineer during non-work hours. The scope of the Contractor's work shall be coordinated with the Engineer. "Perimeter, Fence & Pedestrian Barricades" shall be installed. Safety fencing within the interior of the demolished area shall be provided under this contract and shall be the product of Tenax Corporation, bright orange, no less than five (5) feet in height or approved equal.
- 3. The Engineer shall have the authority, upon proper written notice to the Contractor; if in the opinion of the Engineer, traffic control is inadequate, thereby creating a safety hazard, to stop the progress of work until such time when all deficiencies have been corrected to the satisfaction of the Engineer. In such instance, the Contractor shall have no claim for extra compensation or to extend the contract schedule for such disturbances.
- 4. Permission for ingress and egress to the site shall be obtained by the Contractor. If required, the Contractor shall furnish, place, maintain, and remove steel plates for temporary decking over excavations as directed by the Engineer. The decking shall be of sufficient strength and shall be installed so as to safely support all imposed loads.

# 3.5 SUPPORT FACILITIES INSTALLATION

- A. General: Comply with the following:
  - 1. Provide construction for temporary offices, shops, and sheds located within construction area that is noncombustible according to ASTM E 136. Comply with NFPA 241.
  - 2. Maintain support facilities until Engineer schedules Substantial Completion inspection. Remove before Substantial Completion. Personnel remaining after Substantial Completion will be permitted to use permanent facilities, under conditions acceptable to Owner.
  - 3. Provide materials for dust control in conformance with NJSESC standards and the CCSCD.
  - 4. Apply water by sprinkling methods on the site prior and during the work, to retard the generation of dust in accordance NJSESC standards. Re-treat areas as necessary or when directed by Engineer.
  - 5. All trucks shall have a tarp cover to eliminate spills and dust generation.
  - 6. City streets used as construction access to the site shall be mechanically swept as required to keep clean and free of sediment, when directed by the Construction Manager, Engineer or Owner.
- B. No construction trailer is required for the work associated with this project.
- C. Provide dust-control treatment that is nonpolluting and non-tracking. Reapply treatment as required to minimize dust.
  - 1. Conform to applicable Federal, State and Local laws, rules and regulations which address the requirements of dust control.
  - 2. The minimum level of performance of dust control shall be that no visually noticeable amount of dust generated by the project accumulates on adjoining properties, including vehicles legally parked within the area.
- D. Traffic Controls: Comply with requirements of authorities having jurisdiction.
  - 1. Protect existing site improvements to remain including curbs, pavement, and utilities.
  - 2. Maintain access for fire-fighting equipment and access to fire hydrants.

- E. Parking: Provide temporary parking areas for construction personnel.
- F. Dewatering Facilities and Drains: Comply with requirements of authorities having jurisdiction. Maintain Project site, excavations, and construction free of water.
  - 1. Dispose of rainwater in a lawful manner that will not result in flooding Project or adjoining properties or endanger permanent Work or temporary facilities.
  - 2. Remove snow and ice as required to minimize accumulations.
- G. Project Signs: Provide Project signs as indicated. Unauthorized signs are not permitted.
  - 1. Identification Signs: Provide Project identification signs as indicated on Drawings.
  - 2. Temporary Signs: Provide other signs as indicated and as required to inform public and individuals seeking entrance to Project.
    - a. Provide temporary, directional signs for construction personnel and visitors.
  - 3. Maintain and touch up signs so they are legible at all times.
- H. Waste Disposal Facilities: Provide waste-collection containers in sizes adequate to handle waste from construction operations. Comply with requirements of authorities having jurisdiction.

#### 3.6 PROTECTION OF WORK

- A. All work, equipment, and materials shall be protected at all times during construction activities. Site security is the responsibility of the Contractor.
- B. The Contractor shall protect work from adverse weather conditions including, but not limited to freezing temperatures, rainfall, storm water runoff, snow, high winds (up to 90 mph), etc. Any work insufficiently protected and adversely impacted by these conditions shall be repaired and/or replaced at no additional cost to the Owner, and with no extension of the approved schedule.
- C. All materials used to secure the site and to protect the work shall be incorporated into the Contractor's Site-Specific Health and Safety Plan, which must be submitted to the Owner and Engineer prior to the initiation of site work.
- D. The Contractor shall supply sufficient materials and manpower to properly secure each site and to protect the work in accordance with the submitted Site Specific Health and Safety Plan.
- E. All materials necessary to secure the site and protect the work must be readily available on site on the first day of site work. Proof of this must be demonstrated to the Engineer or the Engineer's representative. The Contractor will not be permitted to initiate or continue work until sufficient and proper materials are on site.

#### 3.7 SECURITY AND PROTECTION FACILITIES INSTALLATION

- A. Protection of Existing Facilities: Protect existing vegetation, equipment, structures, utilities, and other improvements at Project site and on adjacent properties, except those indicated to be removed or altered. Repair damage to existing facilities.
  - 1. Where access to adjacent properties is required in order to affect protection of existing facilities, obtain written permission from adjacent property owner to access property for that purpose.
- B. Environmental Protection: Provide protection, operate temporary facilities, and conduct construction as required to comply with environmental regulations and that minimize possible air, waterway, and subsoil contamination or pollution or other undesirable effects.
- C. Temporary Erosion and Sedimentation Control: Comply with authorities having jurisdiction and requirements specified in Section 311000 "Site Clearing."
- D. Temporary Erosion and Sedimentation Control: Provide measures to prevent soil erosion and discharge of soil-bearing water runoff and airborne dust to undisturbed areas and to adjacent properties and walkways, according to Standards for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control in New Jersey.
  - 1. Verify that flows of water redirected from construction areas or generated by construction activity do not enter or cross tree- or plant-protection zones.
  - 2. Inspect, repair, and maintain erosion- and sedimentation-control measures during construction until permanent vegetation has been established.
  - 3. Clean, repair, and restore adjoining properties and roads affected by erosion and sedimentation from Project site during the course of Project.
  - 4. Remove erosion and sedimentation controls and restore and stabilize areas disturbed during removal.
- E. Stormwater Control: Comply with requirements of authorities having jurisdiction. Provide barriers in and around excavations and subgrade construction to prevent flooding by runoff of stormwater from heavy rains.
- F. Pest Control: Engage pest-control service to recommend practices to minimize attraction and harboring of rodents, roaches, and other pests and to perform extermination and control procedures at regular intervals so Project will be free of pests and their residues at Substantial Completion. Perform control operations lawfully, using materials approved by authorities having jurisdiction.
- G. Site Enclosure Fence: Before construction operations begin, furnish and install site enclosure fence in a manner that will prevent people from easily entering site except by entrance gates.
- H. Security Enclosure and Lockup: Install temporary enclosure around partially completed areas of construction. Provide lockable entrances to prevent unauthorized entrance, vandalism, theft, and similar violations of security. Lock entrances at end of each workday.
- I. Barricades, Warning Signs, and Lights: Comply with requirements of authorities having jurisdiction for erecting structurally adequate barricades, including warning signs and lighting.

- J. Temporary Fire Protection: Install and maintain temporary fire-protection facilities of types needed to protect against reasonably predictable and controllable fire losses. Comply with NFPA 241; manage fire-prevention program.
  - 1. Prohibit smoking in construction areas. Comply with additional limits on smoking specified in other Sections.
  - 2. Supervise welding operations, combustion-type temporary heating units, and similar sources of fire ignition according to requirements of authorities having jurisdiction.
  - 3. Develop and supervise an overall fire-prevention and -protection program for personnel at Project site. Review needs with local fire department and establish procedures to be followed. Instruct personnel in methods and procedures. Post warnings and information.
  - 4. Provide temporary standpipes and hoses for fire protection. Hang hoses with a warning sign stating that hoses are for fire-protection purposes only and are not to be removed. Match hose size with outlet size and equip with suitable nozzles.

# 3.8 SECURITY AND PROTECTION FACILITIES INSTALLATION

- A. Supervision: Enforce strict discipline in use of temporary facilities. To minimize waste and abuse, limit availability of temporary facilities to essential and intended uses.
- B. Maintenance: Maintain facilities in good operating condition until removal.
  - 1. Maintain operation of temporary enclosures, heating, cooling, humidity control, ventilation, and similar facilities on a 24-hour basis where required to achieve indicated results and to avoid possibility of damage.
- C. Termination and Removal: Remove each temporary facility when need for its service has ended, when it has been replaced by authorized use of a permanent facility, or no later than Substantial Completion. Complete or, if necessary, restore permanent construction that may have been delayed because of interference with temporary facility. Repair damaged Work, clean exposed surfaces, and replace construction that cannot be satisfactorily repaired.
  - 1. Materials and facilities that constitute temporary facilities are property of Contractor. Owner reserves right to take possession of Project identification signs.
  - 2. Remove temporary roads and paved areas not intended for or acceptable for integration into permanent construction. Where area is intended for landscape development, remove soil and aggregate fill that do not comply with requirements for fill or subsoil. Remove materials contaminated with road oil, asphalt and other petrochemical compounds, and other substances that might impair growth of plant materials or lawns. Repair or replace street paving, curbs, and sidewalks at temporary entrances, as required by authorities having jurisdiction.
  - 3. At Substantial Completion, repair, renovate, and clean permanent facilities used during construction period. Comply with final cleaning requirements specified in Section 017700 "Closeout Procedures."

# 3.9 MEASUREMENT & PAYMENT

- A. No separate payment will be made for construction facilities, security and protection of work and facilities, and any support required in the lump sum bid. Cost for construction facilities i.e.: temporary signs shall be included in the associated items in the bid.
- B. Payment for Maintenance and Protection of Traffic Control shall be included in the associated items in the bid. The cost shall include placement, removal, relocation and maintenance of all required traffic control devices required to maintain and protect in safe and acceptable conditions for pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

# 1.2 ACTION SUBMITTALS

- A. Product Data: For each type of cleaning agent.
- B. Contractor's List of Incomplete Items: Initial submittal at Substantial Completion.
- C. Certified List of Incomplete Items: Final submittal at final completion.

# 1.3 CLOSEOUT SUBMITTALS

- A. Certificates of Release: From authorities having jurisdiction.
- B. Certificate of Insurance: For continuing coverage.
- C. Field Report: For pest control inspection.

# 1.4 MAINTENANCE MATERIAL SUBMITTALS

A. Schedule of Maintenance Material Items: For maintenance material submittal items specified in other Sections.

# 1.5 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION PROCEDURES

- A. Contractor's List of Incomplete Items: Prepare and submit a list of items to be completed and corrected (Contractor's punch list), indicating the value of each item on the list and reasons why the Work is incomplete.
- B. Submittals Prior to Substantial Completion: Complete the following a minimum of ten (10) days prior to requesting inspection for determining date of Substantial Completion. List items below that are incomplete at time of request.
  - 1. Certificates of Release: Obtain and submit releases from authorities having jurisdiction permitting Owner unrestricted use of the Work and access to services and utilities. Include occupancy permits, operating certificates, and similar releases.
  - 2. Submit closeout submittals specified in other Division 01 Sections, including project record documents, operation and maintenance manuals, damage or settlement surveys, property surveys, and similar final record information.
  - 3. Submit closeout submittals specified in individual Sections, including specific warranties, workmanship bonds, maintenance service agreements, final certifications, and similar documents.
  - 4. Submit maintenance material submittals specified in individual Sections, including tools, spare parts, extra materials, and similar items, and deliver to location designated by Engineer. Label with manufacturer's name and model number.
  - 5. Submit testing, adjusting, and balancing records.
  - 6. Submit sustainable design submittals not previously submitted.
  - 7. Submit changeover information related to Owner's occupancy, use, operation, and maintenance.
- C. Procedures Prior to Substantial Completion: Complete the following a minimum of ten (10) days prior to requesting inspection for determining date of Substantial Completion. List items below that are incomplete at time of request.
  - 1. Advise Owner of pending insurance changeover requirements.
  - 2. Make final changeover of permanent locks and deliver keys to Owner. Advise Owner's personnel of changeover in security provisions.
  - 3. Complete startup and testing of systems and equipment.
  - 4. Perform preventive maintenance on equipment used prior to Substantial Completion.
  - 5. Terminate and remove temporary facilities from Project site, along with mockups, construction tools, and similar elements.
  - 6. Complete final cleaning requirements.
  - 7. Touch up paint and otherwise repair and restore marred exposed finishes to eliminate visual defects.
- D. Inspection: Submit a written request for inspection to determine Substantial Completion a minimum of ten (10) days prior to date the Work will be completed and ready for final inspection and tests. On receipt of request, Engineer will either proceed with inspection or notify Contractor of unfulfilled requirements. Engineer will prepare the Certificate of Substantial Completion after inspection or will notify Contractor of items, either on Contractor's list or additional items identified by Engineer, that must be completed or corrected before certificate will be issued.
  - 1. Request re-inspection when the Work identified in previous inspections as incomplete is completed or corrected.

2. Results of completed inspection will form the basis of requirements for final completion.

# 1.6 FINAL COMPLETION PROCEDURES

- A. Submittals Prior to Final Completion: Before requesting final inspection for determining final completion, complete the following:
  - 1. Submit a final Application for Payment according to the General and Supplementary Conditions in the Construction Specifications.
  - 2. Certified List of Incomplete Items: Submit certified copy of Engineer's Substantial Completion inspection list of items to be completed or corrected (punch list), endorsed and dated by Engineer. Certified copy of the list shall state that each item has been completed or otherwise resolved for acceptance.
  - 3. Certificate of Insurance: Submit evidence of final, continuing insurance coverage complying with insurance requirements.
  - 4. Submit pest-control final inspection report.
  - 5. Submit final completion photographic documentation.
- B. Inspection: Submit a written request for final inspection to determine acceptance a minimum of ten (10) days prior to date the work will be completed and ready for final inspection and tests. On receipt of request, Engineer will either proceed with inspection or notify Contractor of unfulfilled requirements. Engineer will prepare a final Certificate for Payment after inspection or will notify Contractor of construction that must be completed or corrected before certificate will be issued.
  - 1. Request re-inspection when the Work identified in previous inspections as incomplete is completed or corrected.

# 1.7 LIST OF INCOMPLETE ITEMS (PUNCH LIST)

- A. Organization of List: Include name and identification of each space and area affected by construction operations for incomplete items and items needing correction including, if necessary, areas disturbed by Contractor that are outside the limits of construction.
  - 1. Organize list of spaces in sequential order.
  - 2. Organize items applying to each space by major element, including categories for ceiling, individual walls, floors, equipment, and building systems.
  - 3. Include the following information at the top of each page:
    - a. Project Name.
    - b. Date.
    - c. Name of Engineer.
    - d. Name of Contractor.
    - e. Page Number.
  - 4. Submit list of incomplete items in the following format:
    - a. MS Excel electronic file. Engineer will return annotated file.
    - b. PDF electronic file. Engineer will return annotated file.

# 1.8 SUBMITTAL OF PROJECT WARRANTIES

- A. Time of Submittal: Submit written warranties on request of Architect for designated portions of the Work where warranties are indicated to commence on dates other than date of Substantial Completion, or when delay in submittal of warranties might limit Owner's rights under warranty.
- B. Organize warranty documents into an orderly sequence based on the table of contents of Project Manual.
- C. Warranty Electronic File: Provide warranties and bonds in PDF format. Assemble complete warranty and bond submittal package into a single electronic PDF file with bookmarks enabling navigation to each item. Provide bookmarked table of contents at beginning of document.
  - 1. Submit on digital media acceptable to Engineer.

# D. Warranties in Paper Form:

- 1. Bind warranties and bonds in heavy-duty, three-ring, vinyl-covered, loose-leaf binders, thickness as necessary to accommodate contents, and sized to receive 8-1/2-by-11-inch (215-by-280-mm) paper.
- E. Provide additional copies of each warranty to include in operation and maintenance manuals.

#### PART 2 - PRODUCTS

# 2.1 MATERIALS

- A. Cleaning Agents: Use cleaning materials and agents recommended by manufacturer or fabricator of the surface to be cleaned. Do not use cleaning agents that are potentially hazardous to health or property or that might damage finished surfaces.
  - 1. Using cleaning products that comply with Green Seal's GS-37, or if GS-37 is not applicable, use products that comply with the California Code of Regulations maximum allowable VOC levels.

# **PART 3 - EXECUTION**

#### 3.1 FINAL CLEANING

- A. General: Perform final cleaning. Conduct cleaning and waste-removal operations to comply with local laws and ordinances and Federal and local environmental and antipollution regulations.
- B. Cleaning: Employ experienced workers or professional cleaners for final cleaning. Clean each surface or unit to condition expected in an average commercial building cleaning and maintenance program. Comply with manufacturer's written instructions.
  - 1. Complete the following cleaning operations before requesting inspection for certification of Substantial Completion for entire Project or for a designated portion of Project:

- a. Clean Project site, yard, and grounds, in areas disturbed by construction activities, including landscape development areas, of rubbish, waste material, litter, and other foreign substances.
- b. Sweep paved areas broom clean. Remove petrochemical spills, stains, and other foreign deposits.
- c. Rake grounds that are not planted, mulched, or paved to a smooth, even textured surface.
- d. Remove tools, construction equipment, machinery, and surplus material from Project site.
- e. Remove snow and ice to provide safe access to building.
- f. Clean exposed exterior and interior hard-surfaced finishes to a dirt-free condition, free of stains, films, and similar foreign substances. Avoid disturbing natural weathering of exterior surfaces. Restore reflective surfaces to their original condition.
- g. Remove debris and surface dust from limited access spaces, including roofs, plenums, shafts, trenches, equipment vaults, manholes, attics, and similar spaces.
- h. Sweep concrete floors broom clean in unoccupied spaces.
- i. Vacuum carpet and similar soft surfaces, removing debris and excess nap; clean according to manufacturer's recommendations if visible soil or stains remain.
- j. Clean transparent materials, including mirrors and glass in doors and windows. Remove glazing compounds and other noticeable, vision-obscuring materials. Polish mirrors and glass, taking care not to scratch surfaces.
- k. Remove labels that are not permanent.
- 1. Clean plumbing fixtures to a sanitary condition, free of stains, including stains resulting from water exposure.
- m. Replace disposable air filters and clean permanent air filters. Clean exposed surfaces of diffusers, registers, and grills.
- n. Clean ducts, blowers, and coils if units were operated without filters during construction of that display contamination with particulate matter on inspection.
- o. Clean light fixtures, luminaires, lamps, globes, and reflectors to function with full efficiency.
- p. Leave Project clean and ready for occupancy.
- C. Pest Control: Comply with pest control requirements in Section 015000 "Temporary Facilities and Controls." Prepare written report.
- D. Construction Waste Disposal: Comply with waste disposal requirements in Section 015000 "Temporary Facilities and Controls."

#### 3.2 REPAIR OF THE WORK

- A. Complete repair and restoration operations, before requesting inspection for determination of Substantial Completion.
- B. Repair, or remove and replace, defective construction. Repairing includes replacing defective parts, refinishing damaged surfaces, touching up with matching materials, and properly adjusting operating equipment. Where damaged or worn items cannot be repaired or restored, provide replacements. Remove and replace operating components that cannot be repaired. Restore damaged construction and permanent facilities used during construction to specified condition.

- 1. Remove and replace chipped, scratched, and broken glass, reflective surfaces, and other damaged transparent materials.
- 2. Touch up and otherwise repair and restore marred or exposed finishes and surfaces. Replace finishes and surfaces that already show evidence of repair or restoration.
  - a. Do not paint over "UL" and other required labels and identification, including mechanical and electrical nameplates. Remove paint applied to required labels and identification.
- 3. Replace parts subject to operating conditions during construction that may impede operation or reduce longevity.
- 4. Replace burned-out bulbs, bulbs noticeably dimmed by hours of use, and defective and noisy starters in fluorescent and mercury vapor fixtures to comply with requirements for ne fixtures.

# 3.3 REPAIR OF THE WORK

A. The Contractor shall include restoring the site per pre-construction conditions and provide any required warranties and as-builts specified. Cost to be included in the associated items in bid.

#### **SECTION 311000 - SITE CLEARING**

# PART 1 - GENERAL

#### 1.1 SUMMARY

# A. Related Documents

1. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions apply to this Section.

#### B. Section Includes:

- 1. Protecting existing vegetation to remain.
- 2. Removing existing vegetation.
- 3. Clearing and grubbing.
- 4. Stripping and stockpiling topsoil.
- 5. Stripping and stockpiling rock.
- 6. Removing above- and below-grade site improvements.
- 7. Disconnecting, capping, or sealing site utilities.
- 8. Temporary erosion and sedimentation control.

# 1.2 DEFINITIONS

- A. Subsoil: Soil beneath the level of subgrade; soil beneath the topsoil layers of a naturally occurring soil profile, typified by less than 1 percent organic matter and few soil organisms.
- B. Surface Soil: Soil that is present at the top layer of the existing soil profile. In undisturbed areas, surface soil is typically called "topsoil," but in disturbed areas such as urban environments, the surface soil can be subsoil.
- C. Topsoil: Top layer of the soil profile consisting of existing native surface topsoil or existing in-place surface soil; the zone where plant roots grow.
- D. Topsoil: Top layer of the soil profile consisting of existing native surface topsoil or existing in-place surface soil; the zone where plant roots grow. Its appearance is generally friable, pervious, and black or a darker shade of brown, gray, or red than underlying subsoil; reasonably free of subsoil, clay lumps, gravel, and other objects larger than 2 inches in diameter; and free of weeds, roots, toxic materials, or other non-soil materials.
- F. Plant-Protection Zone: Area surrounding individual trees, groups of trees, shrubs, or other vegetation to be protected during construction and indicated on Drawings.
- G. Tree-Protection Zone: Area surrounding individual trees or groups of trees to be protected during construction and indicated on Drawings.
- H. Vegetation: Trees, shrubs, groundcovers, grass, and other plants.

# 1.3 PREINSTALLATION MEETINGS

A. Preinstallation Conference: Conduct conference at Project Site with landscape architect.

# 1.4 MATERIAL OWNERSHIP

A. Except for materials indicated to be stockpiled or otherwise remain Owner's property, cleared materials shall become Contractor's property and shall be removed from Project site.

# 1.5 INFORMATIONAL SUBMITTALS

- A. Existing Conditions: Documentation of existing trees and plantings, adjoining construction, and site improvements that establishes preconstruction conditions that might be misconstrued as damage caused by site clearing.
  - 1. Use sufficiently detailed photographs or video recordings.
  - 2. Include plans and notations to indicate specific wounds and damage conditions of each tree or other plant designated to remain.
- B. Topsoil stripping and stockpiling program.
- C. Rock stockpiling program.
- E. Record Drawings: Identifying and accurately showing locations of capped utilities and other subsurface structural, electrical, and mechanical conditions.
- G. Burning: Documentation of compliance with burning requirements and permitting of authorities having jurisdiction. Identify location(s) and conditions under which burning will be performed. No burning of any material is allowed on site.

# 1.6 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Topsoil Stripping and Stockpiling Program: Prepare a written program to systematically demonstrate the ability of personnel to properly follow procedures and handle materials and equipment during the Work. Include dimensioned diagrams for placement and protection of stockpiles.
- B. Rock Stockpiling Program: Prepare a written program to systematically demonstrate the ability of personnel to properly follow procedures and handle materials and equipment during the Work. Include dimensioned diagrams for placement and protection of stockpiles.

# 1.7 FIELD CONDITIONS

- A. Traffic: Minimize interference with adjoining roads, streets, walks, and other adjacent occupied or used facilities during site-clearing operations.
  - 1. Do not close or obstruct streets, walks, or other adjacent occupied or used facilities without permission from Owner and authorities having jurisdiction.

- 2. Provide alternate routes around closed or obstructed trafficways if required by Owner or authorities having jurisdiction.
- B. Improvements on Adjoining Property: Authority for performing site clearing indicated on property adjoining Owner's property will be obtained by Owner before award of Contract.
  - 1. Do not proceed with work on adjoining property until directed by Engineer.
- C. Salvageable Improvements: Carefully remove items indicated to be salvaged and store on Owner's premises.
- D. Utility Locator Service: Notify New Jersey One Call for area where Project is located before site clearing.
- E. Do not commence site clearing operations until temporary erosion- and sedimentation-control measures are in place.
- F. Tree- and Plant-Protection Zones: Protect according to requirements denoted in Soil Erosion Notes and Details.
- G. Soil Stripping, Handling, and Stockpiling: Perform only when the soil is dry or slightly moist.

# PART 2 - PRODUCTS

#### 2.1 MATERIALS

A. Existing Plant Materials: Any injuries to the plants (i.e.: branches and roots removed) shall be repaired per the current requirements and recommendations by the American Nursery and Landscape Association and by a certified NJ Arborist. No additional payment for this matter will be paid by the owner, Pennoni, and City of Camden.

# PART 3 - EXECUTION

# 3.1 PREPARATION

- A. Protect and maintain benchmarks and survey control points from disturbance during construction.
- B. Verify that trees, shrubs, and other vegetation to remain or to be relocated have been flagged and that protection zones have been identified and enclosed according to requirements in Soil Erosion & Sediment Control Plans, Notes, and Details.
- C. Protect existing site improvements to remain from damage during construction.
  - 1. Restore damaged improvements to their original condition, as acceptable to Owner.

# 3.2 TEMPORARY EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION CONTROL

- A. Provide temporary erosion- and sedimentation-control measures to prevent soil erosion and discharge of soil-bearing water runoff or airborne dust to adjacent properties and walkways, according to erosion- and sedimentation-control Drawings and requirements of authorities having jurisdiction.
- B. Verify that flows of water redirected from construction areas or generated by construction activity do not enter or cross protection zones.
- C. Inspect, maintain, and repair erosion- and sedimentation-control measures during construction until permanent vegetation has been established.
- D. Remove erosion and sedimentation controls and restore and stabilize areas disturbed during removal.

#### 3.3 TREE AND PLANT PROTECTION

- A. Protect trees and plants remaining on-site according to requirements denoted in Soil Erosion Notes and Details.
- B. Repair or replace trees, shrubs, and other vegetation indicated to remain or be relocated that are damaged by construction operations according to requirements denoted in Soil Erosion Notes and Details.
- C. Erect and maintain a temporary fence around drip line of individual trees or around perimeter drip line of groups of trees to remain. The temporary fence material must be approved by the Engineer prior to the installation. Remove fence when construction is complete.
- D. Do not store construction materials, debris, or excavated material within drip line of trees.
- E. Do not permit vehicles, equipment, or foot traffic within drip line of trees.
- F. Do not permit runoff or spillage of noxious materials while mixing, placing, or storing construction materials.
- G. Do not excavate within drip line of trees, unless otherwise indicated by Engineer.
- H. Where excavation for new construction is required within drip line of trees, hand clear and excavate to minimize damage to root systems. Comb soil to expose roots and cleanly cut roots as close to excavation as possible. All work should be under the direction of the Engineer.

#### 3.4 EXISTING UTILITIES

- A. Locate, identify, disconnect, and seal or cap utilities indicated to be removed or abandoned in place.
  - 1. Arrange with utility companies to shut off indicated utilities.
  - 2. Owner will arrange to shut off indicated utilities when requested by contractor.

- B. Interrupting Existing Utilities: Do not interrupt utilities serving facilities occupied by Owner or others, unless permitted under the following conditions and then only after arranging to provide temporary utility services according to requirements indicated:
  - 1. Notify Engineer not less than seven (7) days in advance of proposed utility interruptions.
  - 2. Do not proceed with utility interruptions without Engineer's written permission.
  - 3. Contractor is required to coordinate/ notify PSE&G, Camden County Public Works, American Water Camden, and any other utility company prior to any interruption of existing utilities. All cost to be included in the coast of the associated items in the lump sum bid.
- C. Excavate for and remove underground utilities indicated to be removed.
- D. Test Pits: Test pits shall be utilized to locate existing utilities where excavation for the installation of items such as inlets, manholes, cso units, fire hydrants, traffic control boxes, existing castings, pipes, laterals, and foundations for street lights. All work to be included in the cost of the associated items in the lump sum bid.

# 3.5 CLEARING AND GRUBBING

- A. Remove obstructions, trees, shrubs, and other vegetation to permit installation of new construction.
  - 1. Do not remove trees, shrubs, and other vegetation indicated to remain or to be relocated.
  - 2. Grind down stumps and remove roots, obstructions, and debris to a depth of 18 inches (450 mm) below exposed subgrade.
  - 3. Use only hand methods or air spade for grubbing within protection zones.
  - 4. Chip removed tree branches and dispose of off-site.
- B. Fill depressions caused by clearing and grubbing operations with satisfactory soil material unless further excavation or earthwork is indicated.
  - 1. Place fill material in horizontal layers not exceeding a loose depth of 8 inches (200 mm) and compact each layer to a density equal to adjacent original ground.

# 3.6 TOPSOIL STRIPPING

- A. Remove sod and grass before stripping topsoil.
- B. Strip topsoil to depth of 6 inches (150 mm) in a manner to prevent intermingling with underlying subsoil or other waste materials.
  - 1. Remove subsoil and nonsoil materials from topsoil, including clay lumps, gravel, and other objects larger than 2 inches in diameter; trash, debris, weeds, roots, and other waste materials.
- C. Stockpile topsoil away from edge of excavations without intermixing with subsoil or other materials. Grade and shape stockpiles to drain surface water. Cover to prevent windblown dust and erosion by water.

- 1. Limit height of topsoil stockpiles to 72 inches.
- 2. Do not stockpile topsoil within protection zones.
- 3. Dispose of surplus topsoil. Surplus topsoil is that which exceeds quantity indicated to be stockpiled or reused.
- 4. Stockpile surplus topsoil to allow for respreading deeper topsoil.

# 3.7 SITE IMPROVEMENTS

- A. Remove existing above- and below-grade improvements as indicated and necessary to facilitate new construction.
- B. Remove slabs, paving, curbs, gutters, and aggregate base as indicated.
  - 1. Unless existing full-depth joints coincide with line of demolition, neatly saw-cut along line of existing pavement to remain before removing adjacent existing pavement. Saw-cut faces vertically.
  - 2. Paint cut ends of steel reinforcement in concrete to remain with two coats of antirust coating, following coating manufacturer's written instructions. Keep paint off surfaces that will remain exposed.
  - 3. All disturbed City Monuments must be reinstalled by a New Jersey Licensed Surveyor in accordance with City requirements and elevations. Any existing survey monument covers missing and/or damage must be replaced. Prior to ordering the monument covers, the Contractor must contact the City for the approved required cover type.

# 3.8 DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS AND WASTE MATERIALS

- A. Remove surplus soil material, unsuitable topsoil, obstructions, demolished materials, and waste materials including trash and debris, and legally dispose of them off Owner's property.
- B. Burning tree, shrub, and other vegetation waste is permitted according to burning requirements and permitting of authorities having jurisdiction. Control such burning to produce the least smoke or air pollutants and minimum annoyance to surrounding properties. Burning of other waste and debris is prohibited.
- C. Separate recyclable materials produced during site clearing from other nonrecyclable materials. Store or stockpile without intermixing with other materials, and transport them to recycling facilities. Do not interfere with other Project work.

# 3.9 MEASUREMENT & PAYMENT

A. No payment for Site Clearing will be made in the bid. Cost to be included in associated items in the bid. Site items denoted outside the limit of work area shall be maintained and protected. Contractor is to limit the amount of removal and disturbance around the project site. Any damage to any existing conditions must be repaired and replaced at contractor's own expense.

# PART 2 MATERIALS

# 2.01 MANUFACTURER

- B. Product shall be from a qualified manufacturer having a minimum of five (5) years experience manufacturing of zinc galvanized and polyester powder coated steel chain link fencing.

    - 3. Top, Middle and Bottom Rail and Braces 1 5/8 inch O.D.
- B. Frame Coatings: In accordance with ASTM F1043, apply supplemental color coating of 10 min. thickness of thermally fused Polyolefin Color: Galvanized, to match fence fabric.

# 2.05 CHAIN LINK SWING GATES

- A. Gate Frames: Fabricate chain link swing gates in accordance with ASTM F 900, using two inch (2") square tubular galvanized steel members, weighing 2.60 lb/ft. Fusion or stainless steel welded connections forming rigid one-piece unit.
- B. Chain Link Gate Fabric: MATCH FENCE FABRIC. Install fabric with hook bolts and tension bars at all 4 sides. Attach to gate frame at not more than 15" on center.
- C. Hardware materials: Hot dipped galvanized steel or malleable iron shapes to suit gate size.
- D. Finish for Gate Frame, Fabric and Hardware: MATCH FENCING.
- E. Hinges: Structurally capable of supporting gate leaf and allow opening and closing without binding. Non-lift-off type hinge design shall permit gate to swing 180° outward.
  - F. Latch: Forked type capable of retaining gate in closed position and have provision for padlock. Latch shall permit operation from either side of gate.
- G. Keeper: Provide keeper for each gate leaf. Gate keeper shall consist of mechanical device for securing free end of gate when in full open position.
- H. Double gates: Provide drop rod to hold inactive leaf. Provide gate stop pipe to engage center drop rod. Provide locking device and padlock eyes as an integral part of latch, requiring one padlock for locking both gate leaves.

I. Gate posts: Steel pipe,[ASTM F 1083] standard weight schedule 40; minimum yield strength of 25,000 psi, size as indicated below.

# 2.06 ACCESSORIES

General: Chain link fence accessories: ASTM F626 Provide items required to complete fence system. Galvanize each ferrous metal item and finish to match framing.

- A. Post caps: Formed steel alloy weather tight closure cap for tubular posts. Provide one cap for each post.
- B. Top rail and brace rail ends: Pressed steel per ASTM F626, for connection of rail and brace to terminal posts.
- C. Top rail sleeves: 7" expansion sleeve with spring, allowing for expansion and contraction of top rail.
- D. Wire ties: 9 gauge [0.148"] galvanized steel wire for attachment of fabric to line posts. Double wrap 13 gauge [0.092"] for rails and braces. Hog ring ties of 12-1/2 gauge [0.0985"] for attachment of fabric to tension wire.
- E. Brace and tension (stretcher bar) bands: Pressed steel. At square post provide tension bar clips.
- F. Tension wire: Metallic coated steel wire, 7 gauge, 0.177" diameter core wire with tensile strength of 75,000 psi. Finish: SAME AS FENCE FRAME AND FABRIC.
- G. Tension (stretcher) bars: One-piece lengths equal to 2 inches less than full height of fabric with a minimum cross-section of 3/16" x 3/4" or equivalent fiber glass rod. Provide tension (stretcher) bars where chain link fabric meets terminal posts.
- H. Truss Rods and Tightener: Steel rods with minimum diameter of 5/16". Capable of withstanding a tension of minimum 2,000 lbs.
- I. Nuts and bolts shall be galvanized, not vinyl coated.

# 2.07 SETTING MATERIALS

A. Concrete: Minimum 28-day compressive strength of 3500 psi minimum.

#### PART 3 CONSTRUCTION

# 3.01 EXAMINATION

- A. Verify areas to receive fencing are completed to final grades and elevations.
- B. Ensure property lines and legal boundaries of work are clearly established.
- C. Verify areas to assure sufficient space to receive slide gates in open position, (gate and overhang.)

# 3.02 CHAIN LINK FENCE FRAMING INSTALLATION

- A. Install chain link fence in accordance with ASTM F567 and manufacturer's instructions to be even grade between terminal/corner posts.
- B. Locate terminal post at each fence termination and change in horizontal or vertical direction of 30° or more.
  - C. Space line posts uniformly at the following dimensions:
    - 8 ft. o.c. maximum for 4 ft. to 8 ft. high fence
    - 10 ft. o.c. maximum for fence greater than 8 ft. in height
  - D. Concrete set [terminal] [and] [gate] posts: Drill holes in firm, undisturbed or compacted soil. Holes shall have diameter 4 times greater than outside dimension of post, and depths approximately 6" deeper than post bottom. Excavate deeper as required for adequate support in soft and loose soils, and for posts with heavy lateral loads. Set post bottom 36" below surface when in firm, undisturbed soil. Place concrete around posts in a continuous pour. Trowel finish around post. Slope to direct water away from posts.
  - E. Drive Anchor [line] posts: With protective cap, drive post 36" into ground. Slightly below ground level install drive anchor shoe fitting. Install 2 diagonal drive anchors and tighten in the shoe.
  - F. Check each post for vertical and top alignment and maintain in position during placement and finishing operations.
- G. Bracing: Install horizontal pipe brace at mid-height for fences 6' (1829 mm) and over, on each side of terminal posts. Firmly attach with fittings. Install diagonal truss rods at these points. Adjust truss rod, ensuring posts remain plumb.
- H. Tension wire: Provide tension wire at bottom of fabric [and at top if top rail is not specified]. Install tension wire before stretching fabric and attach to each post with ties. Secure tension wire to fabric with 12-1/2 gauge [0.0985"] hog rings 24" oc.
  - I. Top rail: Install lengths, 21'. Connect joints with sleeves for rigid connections for expansion/contraction.

- J. Center Rails (for fabric height 12' and over). Install mid rails between posts with fittings and accessories.
  - K. Bottom Rails: Install bottom rails between posts with fittings and accessories.

## 3.03 CHAIN LINK FABRIC INSTALLATION

- A. Fabric: Install fabric on security side and attach so that fabric remains in tension after pulling force is released. Leave approximately 2" between finish grade and bottom selvage. Attach fabric with wire ties to line posts at 15" on center and to rails, braces, and tension wire at 24" (600 mm) on center.
- B. Tension (stretcher) bars: Pull fabric taut; thread tension bar through fabric and attach to terminal posts with bands or clips spaced maximum of 15" on center.

# 3.04 CHAIN LINK SWING GATE INSTALLATION

#### A. Gate Posts

- 1. Install gate posts in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- 2. Concrete set gate posts: Drill holes in firm, undisturbed or compacted soil. Holes shall have diameter 4 times greater than outside dimension of post, and depths approximately 6" deeper than post bottom. Excavate deeper as required for adequate support in soft and loose soils, and for posts with heavy lateral loads. Set post bottom 36" below surface when in firm, undisturbed soil. Place concrete around posts in a continuous pour. Trowel finish around post and slope to direct water away from posts.
- 3. Gate posts and hardware: Set keeper, stops, sleeves into concrete. Check each post for vertical and top alignment and maintain in position during placement and finishing operations.

# B. Swing Gate

- 1. Install gates plumb, level, and secure for full opening without interference.
- 2. Attach hardware by means which will prevent unauthorized removal.
- 3. Adjust hardware for smooth operation.

## 3.05 ACCESSORIES

- A. Tie wires: Bend ends of wire to minimize hazard to persons and clothing.
- B. Fasteners: Install nuts on side of fence opposite fabric side for added security.

C. Barbed wire: Not allowed to be used.

# 3.06 CLEANING

A. Clean up debris and unused material and remove from the site.

# PART 4 – MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

# 4.1 Measurement

- A. The quantity of new chain-link fencing, 6 feet tall will be the amount of linear footage installed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.
- B. The quantity of chain-link fencing 'removed and replaced, 6' tall' will be the amount of linear footage installed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.
- C. The quantity of chain-link fencing 'removed and replaced, 8' tall' will be the amount of linear footage installed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.
- D. The quantity of temporary chain-link fence removed will be the amount of linear footage removed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.
- E. The quantity of miscellaneous chain-link fence work will be a lump sum amount that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.

# 4.2 Payment

A. Payment for new chain-link fence, 6 feet tall shall be made at the linear foot price as shown in the bid. Cost shall include fence, coordination, construction of footings, excavation, restoring damaged areas by the contractor operations, turf repair, environmental restoration, any required testing, concrete, transportation, hauling, moving, delivery, all materials, labor, equipment, removing of material, and all else necessary to complete the work. This includes but not limited to dome cap, brace band, tension band, terminal post, chain link fabric, truss rod tightener, truss rod, brace rail, rail end combination, loop cap, rail end, line post, tension bar, corner post, tension wire, carriage bolts & nuts, line rail clamp, etc.

- B. Payment for removed and replaced chain-link fence, 6 feet tall shall be made at the linear foot price as shown in the bid. Cost shall include fence, coordination, construction of footings, restoring damaged areas by the contractor operations, turf repair, environmental restoration, any required testing, removing of existing damage chain-link fence/post/rail/etc., concrete, stockpiling on-site to be reused, transportation, hauling, moving, delivery, all materials, labor, equipment, and all else necessary to complete the work. This includes but not limited to dome cap, brace band, tension band, terminal post, chain link fabric, truss rod tightener, truss rod, brace rail, rail end combination, loop cap, rail end, line post, tension bar, corner post, tension wire, carriage bolts & nuts, line rail clamp, etc.
- C. Payment for removed and replaced chain-link fence, 8 feet tall shall be made at the linear foot price as shown in the bid. Cost shall include fence, coordination, construction of footings, restoring damaged areas by the contractor operations, turf repair, environmental restoration, any required testing, removing of existing damage chain-link fence/post/rail/etc., concrete, transportation, hauling, moving, delivery, all materials, labor, equipment, and all else necessary to complete the work. This includes but not limited to dome cap, brace band, tension band, terminal post, chain link fabric, truss rod tightener, truss rod, brace rail, rail end combination, loop cap, rail end, line post, tension bar, corner post, tension wire, carriage bolts & nuts, line rail clamp, etc.
- D. Payment for removing temporary fence, 6 feet tall shall be made at the linear foot price as shown in the bid. Cost shall include coordination, stockpiling temporary fence and temporary foundation at a location determined by owner/Pennoni, labor, material, equipment, transportation, hauling, moving, delivery, and all else necessary to complete the work.
- E. Payment for removing existing 6' tall chain-link fence shall be made at the linear foot price as shown in bid. This does not include any existing chain-link fence to be removed and replaced as specified in the plans and construction specifications. Cost shall include coordination, excavation, removal of all pole foundations (required to be removed), backfilling and compacting foundation holes with dense graded aggregate, removal of concrete, transportation, hauling, moving, delivery, labor, equipment, material, and all else necessary to complete work.
- F. Payment for miscellaneous fence work shall be made at a lump sum price in bid. Cost shall include coordination, removing and replacing damaged post/rail/etc., re-connect/re-tie chain link fence to replaced post/rail/etc., excavation, concrete, turf/pavement/concrete repair, environmental restoration (if required), required testing (if required), all materials, labor, equipment, transportation, removal of material from site, hauling, delivery, and all else necessary to complete work. This includes but not limited to dome cap, brace band, tension band, terminal post, chain link fabric, truss rod tightener, truss rod, brace rail, rail end combination, loop cap, rail end, line post, tension bar, corner post, tension wire, carriage bolts & nuts, line rail clamp, etc.

G. No compensation will be made for any material lost and/or stolen. Contractor will be required to replace at their own expense. Contractor is required to secure any and all material(s) left on-site. Contractor can coordinate with PACC to discuss possible locations to store material (new & existing) to be used within parking lot 31.

# PART 1 - GENERAL

# 1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

A. Drawings and general provisions of the Contract, including General and Supplementary Conditions and Division 1 Specification Sections, apply to this Section.

# 1.2 SUMMARY

A. The Contractor by submitting the bid must acknowledge that they have visited the site and understands the bid submitted meets the intent of the drawing. The intent is to supply and construct the fence, pedestrian and driveway gates per the drawings. To review owner's existing stockpile of black aluminum fence, Contractor will be required to contact Matt Moseley, Operations Manager PACC at:

#### 1.3 SYSTEM DESCRIPTION

A. The manufacturer shall supply a total industrial steel fence system of the Ameristar® Aegis II® Classic, 3-Rail, or approved equal, design. The system shall include all components (i.e., pickets, rails, posts, gates and hardware) required.

# 1.4 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. The Contractor shall provide laborers and supervisors who are thoroughly familiar with the type of construction involved and materials and techniques specified.
- B. The contractor installing fences and gates must have a representative that has a minimum of 5 years experience onsite. An experience installer who has completed fences and gates similar in material, design, and extent those indicated for this project and whose work has resulted in construction with a record of successful in-service performance.
- C. A meeting between the Engineer and contractor must be established prior to the fence contractor starting work.
- D. The contractor is required to follow the requirements established in the plans and Construction Facilities and Temporary Control specifications and/or under the direction of the Engineer in establishing temporary traffic and pedestrian control for the project.

# 1.6 SUBMITTAL

- A. The contractor is required to submit the manufacturer's submittal package prior to installation.
- B. Shop drawings should include construction details, sections, sizes, weights, material descriptions, attachment information, dimensions of individual components and profiles, and finishes for fences and gates. Product certifications for the fences and gates must be signed by the product manufacturer.

# 1.7 PRODUCT HANDLING AND STORAGE

A. Upon receipt at the job site, all materials shall be checked to ensure that no damage occurred during shipping or handling. Materials shall be stored in such a manner to ensure proper ventilation and drainage, and to protect against damage, weather, vandalism and theft.

#### PART 2 - PRODUCTS

# 2.1 MANUFACTURER

A. The ornamental fence system shall conform to Ameristar® Aegis II® Classic, Style C3 (3-Rail) style manufactured by Ameristar® Fence Products, Inc., or approved equal.

#### 2.2 MATERIAL

- A. Steel material for fence framework (i.e., tubular pickets, tails and posts), when galvanized prior to forming, shall conform to the requirements of ASTM A924/A924M, with a minimum yield strength of 50,000 psi (344 MPa). The steel shall be hot-dip galvanized to meet the requirements of ASTM A653/A653M with a minimum zinc coating weight of 0.90 oz/ft² (276 g/m²), Coating Designation G-90.
- B. The manufactured galvanized framework shall be subjected to the PermaCoat® thermal stratification coating process (high-temperature, in-line, multi-stage, multi-layer) including, as a minimum, a six-stage pretreatment/wash (with zinc phosphate), an electrostatic spray application of an epoxy base, and a separate electrostatic spray application of a polyester finish. The base coat shall be a thermosetting epoxy powder coating (gray in color) with a minimum thickness of 2 mils (0.0508mm). The topcoat shall be a "no-mar" TGIC polyester powder coat finish with a minimum thickness of 2 mils (0.0508mm). The color shall be Black. The stratification-coated framework shall be capable of meeting the performance requirements for each quality characteristic shown in Table 1.
- C. Material for fence pickets shall be 1" square x 14 Ga.tubing. The cross-sectional shape of the rails shall conform to the manufacturer's ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> design with outside cross-section dimensions of 1.75" square and a minimum thickness of 14 Ga. Picket holes in the ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> rail shall be spaced 4.715" o.c., except for Invincible<sup>TM</sup> style 6' long which shall be spaced 4.98" o.c. Picket retaining rods shall be 0.125" diameter galvanized steel. Posts shall be a minimum of 2-1/2" square x 12 Ga. High quality PVC grommets shall be supplied to seal all picket-to-rail intersections.
- D. Swing gates must be fabricated using 1.75" x 14 Ga Forerunner double channel rail, 2" sq. x 12 GA gate ends, and 1" sq. x 14 GA pickets. Gates that exceed 6' in width will have 1 1.75" sq. x 14 GA intermediate upright. All rail and upright intersections shall be joined by welding. All picket and rail intersections must be joined by welding.

# 2.3 FABRICATION – ORNAMENTAL FENCE

- A. Pickets, rails and posts shall be pre-cut to specified lengths. ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> rails shall be pre-punched to accept pickets.
- B. Grommets shall be inserted into the pre-punched holes in the rails and pickets shall be inserted through the grommets so that pre-drilled picket holes align with the internal upper raceway of the ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> rails. (Note: This can best be accomplished by using an alignment template). Retaining rods shall be inserted into each ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> rail so that they pass through the pre-drilled holes in each picket, thus completing the panel assembly.

- C. Completed panels shall be capable of supporting a 600 lb. load (applied at midspan) without permanent deformation. Panels without rings shall be bias able to a 25% change in grade; panels with rings shall be biasable to a 12.5% change in grade.
- D. Swing gates shall be fabricated using AEGIS II® Classic panel material and gate ends having the same outside cross-section dimensions as the ForeRunner<sup>TM</sup> rail. All rail and upright intersections shall be joined by welding. All picket and rail intersections shall also be joined either by welding or by the same retaining rod process used for panel assembly.

#### PART 3 - EXECUTION

# 3.1 PREPARATION

A. All new installation shall be laid out by the contractor in accordance with the construction plans.

# 3.2 INSTALLATION

- A. Fence posts shall be set in accordance with the spacings shown in Table 2, plus or minus 1/2", depending on the nominal span specified. Gate posts shall be spaced according to the gate openings specified in the construction plans, dependent on standard out-to-out gate leaf dimensions and gate hardware. Type and quantity of gate and fence hinges must be based on the application: weight, height, and number of gate cycles. The manufacturers' gate drawings identifies the necessary gate hardware required for completion of work. Gate hardware must be provided by the manufacture of the gate and be installed per manufacturer's recommendation. Contractor is to follow material requirements specified in plan details related to "Earthwork" and "Concrete work" when installing posts and post base material. AEGIS II® Classic panels shall be attached to posts using mechanically fastened panel brackets supplied by the manufacturer.
- B. When cutting/drilling rails or posts; adhere to the following steps to seal the exposed surfaces:
  - 1. Remove all metal shavings from cut/drill area.
  - 2. Apply custom finish paint matching fence color. Failure to seal exposed surface per steps 1 & 2 will negate warranty. Ameristar spray cans or paint pens shall be used to finish exposed surfaces. It is recommended that paint pens be used to prevent overspray. Use of non-Ameristar parts or components will negate the manufactures warranty.

#### 3.3 CLEANING

A. The contractor shall clean the jobsite of excess materials; post-hole excavations shall be scattered uniformly away from posts.

#### PART 4 - COMPENSATION

# 4.1 MEASUREMENT

- A. The quantity of black aluminum estate fencing will be the amount of linear footage installed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.
- B. The quantity of black aluminum estate gate(s) will be the unit amount installed that is in accordance with the plans and construction specifications or as directed by the engineer.

# 4.2 PAYMENT

- A. Payment for black aluminum estate fencing will be made at the linear foot price in the bid. Contractor is to use owner's stockpiled existing black aluminum estate fence to replace existing damaged estate fence in parking lot. Cost must include the removal and replacing fence, resetting existing fence, reconnecting existing fence (posts, rails, etc.), removing and replacing fence post(s) (when required & under direction of engineer), construction of footings, concrete (when required), restoring damaged areas by the contractor operations, turf/pavement/concrete repair, environmental restoration (f required), any required testing, all materials, labor, equipment, transportation, removal of material from site, hauling, delivery, and all else necessary to complete the work. #### PREVAILING WAGE RATE DETERMINATION

The New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act (N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.25 et seq.) requires that the Department of Labor and Workforce Development establish and enforce a prevailing wage level for workers engaged in public works in order to safeguard their efficiency and general well being and to protect them as well as their employers from the effects of serious and unfair competition.

Prevailing wage rates are wage and fringe benefit rates based on the collective bargaining agreements established for a particular craft or trade in the locality in which the public work is performed. In New Jersey, these rates vary by county and by the type of work performed.

Applicable prevailing wage rates are those wages and fringe benefits in effect on the date the contract is awarded. All pre-determined rate increases listed at the time the contract is awarded must also be paid, beginning on the dates specified. Rates that have expired will remain in effect until new rates are posted.

## **Prevailing Wage Rate**

The prevailing wage rate for each craft will list the effective date of the rate and the following information:

W =Wage Rate per Hour

**B** = Fringe Benefit Rate per Hour\*

T = Total Rate per Hour

\* Fringe benefits are an integral part of the prevailing wage rate. Employers not providing such benefits must pay the fringe benefit amount directly to the employee each payday. Employers providing benefits worth less than the fringe benefit amount must pay the balance directly to the employee each payday.

Unless otherwise stated in the Prevailing Wage Rate Determination, the fringe benefit rate for overtime hours remains at the straight time rate.

When the Overtime Notes in the Prevailing Wage Rate Determination state that the overtime rates are "inclusive of benefits," the benefit rate is increased by the same factor as the wage rate (i.e. multiplied by 1.5 for time and one-half, multiplied by 2 for double time, etc.).

# **Apprentice Rate Schedule**

An "apprentice" is an individual who is registered with the United States Department of Labor - Office of Apprenticeship and enrolled in a certified apprenticeship program during the period in which they are working on the public works project.

The apprentice <u>wage</u> rate is a percentage of the journeyman wage rate, unless otherwise indicated. The apprentice <u>benefit</u> rate is the full journeyman benefit rate, unless otherwise indicated.

If there is no apprentice rate schedule listed, the individual must be paid at least the journeyman rate even if that individual is in a certified apprentice program for that trade.

If there is no ratio of apprentices to journeymen listed for a particular craft, then the ratio shall be one (1) apprentice to every four (4) journeymen.

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#### Comments/Notes

For each craft listed there will be comments/notes that cover the definition of the regular workday, shift differentials, overtime, recognized holidays, and any other relevant information.

#### **Public Works Contractor Registration**

The Public Works Contractor Registration Act (N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.48, et seq.) requires that **all** contractors, subcontractors, or lower tier subcontractors who are working on or who bid on public works projects register with the Department of Labor and Workforce Development. Applications are available at <a href="https://www.nj.gov/labor">www.nj.gov/labor</a> (click on Wage & Hour and then go to Registration & Permits).

#### Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.51:

No contractor shall bid on any contract for public work as defined in section 2 of P.L.1963, c. 150 (C.34:11-56.26) unless the contractor is registered pursuant to this act. No contractor shall list a subcontractor in a bid proposal for the contract unless the subcontractor is registered pursuant to P.L.1999, c.238 (C.34:11-56.48 et seq.) at the time the bid is made. No contractor or subcontractor, including a subcontractor not listed in the bid proposal, shall engage in the performance of any public work subject to the contract, unless the contractor or subcontractor is registered pursuant to that act.

# **Snow Plowing**

Snow plowing contracts are <u>not</u> subject to the New Jersey Prevailing Wage Act or the Public Works Contractor Registration Act.

These rates apply to the following: welding on Transportation Mainline pipe lines (cross-country pipe lines, or any segments thereof, transporting coal, gas, oil, water or other transportable materials, vapors or liquids, including portions of such pipe lines within private property boundaries up to the final metering station or connection - the point where a valve, consumer connection, or town border station divides mainline transmission lines or higher pressure lateral and branch lines from lower pressure distribution systems).

#### PER DIEM PAYMENT:

In addition to the total wage rate paid for each craft, the following per diem (per day) amounts must also be paid - Pipeline Journeyman: \$80.50; Pipeline Journeyman Welder: \$140.50; and Pipeline Helper: \$64.50. Note: in order to receive the per diem payment an employee must work a minimum of 8 hours in a 24 hour period.

#### NOTES:

- Journeymen employed as "stringer bead" welders and journeymen who are regularly employed as "hot-pass" welders shall receive \$1.00 per hour more than other journeymen.
- Welders running "stringer bead" or "hot-pass" on "cutouts" or "tie-ins" on a production basis shall be paid \$1.00 per hour above the journeymen rate.
- Whenever a welder helper is employed using a power buffer or power grinder immediately behind the stringer bead and/or hot-pass welders, and the pipe gang is set on a production basis, the helper shall be paid \$2.00 per hour above the helper rate.
- If back welding is performed inside a pipe under either or both of the following conditions, the welder engaged in the welding will receive \$3.00 per hour above the regular rate for the job only for the days on which such back welding is performed:
  - The employer elects, as a regular procedure, to back weld each line-up. This condition is not intended to apply to occasional back welding performed by the pipe gang to repair a bead, to rectify a "high-lo" condition or wall thickness, etc.
  - A welder is required to back weld a completed weld behind the firing line.
- If the welder helper is required to go inside the pipe for the purpose of brushing, buffing and grinding the weld, they shall receive a wage rate \$1.00 per hour above the regular

helper rate for the days involved.

- Welders working on "hot work" shall be paid \$2.00 per hour above the regular rate for each day engaged in such work. "Hot work' is defined as work on lines in service where there is the danger of fire or explosion.
